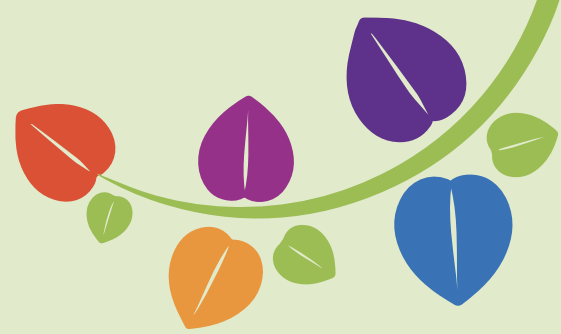


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# Welcome

"Burton Fields School is a diverse school with children from many different backgrounds, cultures and religions. As a UNICEF Gold Rights Respecting School, we have a warm and nurturing environment because we believe that everyone belongs no matter who they are or where they come from. Burton Fields is more than just a school; it is a community full of welcoming, resilient and hard-working pupils and teachers.

We are very lucky that we have beautiful grounds where we are able to be outside doing outdoor learning in our geography lessons and lots of extra-curricular activities that are good for our health and well-being.

Along the corridors are displays of children's work and achievements because we believe that all children should be celebrated. - Making sure their child wears the correct uniform every day and has the appropriate PE kit
- Supporting the school in the teaching of safe and secure internet use at school and home
- Ensuring the school is notified of any change in emergency contact numbers

## Pupils at Burton Fields School, follow the 5R's of Learning:



### Readiness

**Ready to Learn** – "I will always be Right-minded, Equipped, Alert, Determined, and ready to say 'Yes!' to great learning experiences"



### Resourcefulness

**Resourceful** – "I will have lots of fantastic ideas to contribute and I will work well in groups as well as on my own"



### Reflection

**Reflective** – "I will think about what I am learning, I will listen to others' ideas and opinions, and I will always look for ways to improve and learn even more"



### Resilience

**Resilient** – "I will have a positive approach to learning, and never give up even if I find a task difficult or challenging"



### Responsibility

**Responsible** – "I will always make the right choices and think for myself; I will always be in the right place, at the right time, doing the right thing, in the right way!"



# We are proud to be a **UNICEF Gold 'Rights Respecting' School**

**Burton Fields School aims to be a school where every aspect of a child is focused on and developed, including the area of well-being. As part of our school's aims to promote a happy and successful school, we hold national recognition as a UNICEF Gold 'Rights Respecting School'.**

The 'Rights Respecting School' Award strategy (RRSA) helps our pupils to grow into confident, caring and responsible young citizens both in school and within the wider community. By learning about their rights our pupils, your children, also learn about the importance of respecting the rights of others.

As a Rights Respecting School we teach the children that they have rights under the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC). From this starting point they also learn

their responsibility to respect each other's rights in the community. Rights are not the same as 'wants'. Rights are the basic human needs and values that should apply to everyone. As Duty Bearers, we recognise that we all have a responsibility to ensure that the children in our care are able to access their universal rights. We also encourage our children to take responsibility for their actions so that they do not prevent others' accessing their rights.

UNICEF outlines the articles which define these rights in more detail. To help our children learn about their rights, each month we focus on a different 'Article of the Month'. These are introduced to the pupils in an assembly led by the Rights Squad, and then all the assemblies delivered by teachers during that month link closely to this to develop everyone's understanding.

# Outdoor Learning

At Burton Fields School, we want our pupils to thrive so that they enjoy learning, lead safe and healthy lives and make a positive contribution to society. We believe we have a responsibility to prepare our pupils for the challenges and opportunities they will face – with the appropriate knowledge, skills and pastoral care.

An important part of this is our outdoor learning provision. Linked closely to the National Curriculum, we aim to enhance learning and provide our pupils with a deeper understanding of the world and their place within it.

Our outdoor learning lessons are closely linked to our curriculum, particularly Geography, where we develop many skills through outdoor fieldwork. They also link closely to the Department for Education's Sustainability and Climate Change Strategy, published April 2022.

Children and young people are worried about climate change and want to know more about the impact it is having now and how it will impact their future lives.

We will use our Climate Action Plan to identify further topics to explore based on sustainability and climate change, so topics studied include: life-cycles, habitats, identification, food chains, planting, water pollution, litter picking, deforestation,

recycling, reusing, reducing, composting and Fair trade.

- Encouraging pupils to find an emotional bond with, and love for, nature.
- Encouraging pupils to take time to appreciate the beauty of nature.
- Encouraging pupils to think about the meaning and signs of nature.
- Encouraging pupils to show compassion and care for nature.

Throughout our sessions, we make links between the UN Rights of the Child and The Global Sustainable Development Goals. These links allow our pupils to see their part in the wider world and aim for equality for all.





# International Eco-Schools Award

At Burton Fields School, we are proud to be recognised as a **'Green Flag with Distinction'** Eco School for our 'continued excellence in improving environmental performance and learning'.

We are also extremely proud to have been named as an 'Eco School of the Year' – one of only five school nationally in 2024.

Our Eco-Committee, comprising representatives from all classes throughout the school, lead a variety of initiatives throughout the school year.

## Here is what International Eco-Schools said about us:

*"Having been an Eco-School for several years, Burton Fields have already made vast improvements to their setting – with a particular focus on providing outdoor learning spaces and opportunities to young people who may not have access to outdoor space at home. Their school had already introduced various features, including outdoor classrooms, ponds, wildlife areas, a bog garden, and a dedicated outdoor learning teacher. With the improvements already made to their school, and a packed school calendar, their Eco-Committee had a tough challenge thinking of further improvements.*

*With this in mind, their Action Plan this year focused on expanding their Eco-Schools' work beyond school boundaries. They loaned litter-picking equipment to families, turned Walk to School Week into Walk Week with at-home challenges for pupils to complete, engaged in community planting, and provided parents with advice on supporting biodiversity at home. Their commitment to sharing knowledge and expanding their impacts into their community makes Burton Fields School a deserving recipient of one of our Eco-Schools of the Year awards."*

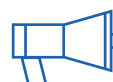
