Radley College

Radley College is an independent full boarding school for boys aged 13-18 in Oxfordshire. Named Best Public School 2024 by Tatler, we are proud of our position as one of the world's leading schools, but it is our ability to unlock the potential in every boy and the sense of community here that makes us special.

Founded in 1847, Radley is proud of its tradition but is celebrated for academic excellence, innovation, and dynamism. We are fortunate to do all of this on a beautiful 800-acre campus with genuinely worldclass facilities a few miles from the thriving city of Oxford.

We aim to nurture intellectual entrepreneurs; boys who can use their strong academic understanding to solve real-world problems. Exam results matter and our excellent A-Level and GCSE results evidence this. But we know that life doesn't have a syllabus, so we work hard to equip boys with the characteristics, life skills and values that will help them thrive in the workplace and in life.

Beyond the classroom, opportunities are limitless. Our boys excel on the sports field, in the concert hall, on stage and as part of our partnerships programme. Community is the central pillar of our ethos. All our boys meet in Chapel five days a week and we eat centrally, which helps to foster a sense of connection across the College

The Department

For many boys at Radley, drama plays a significant role in their time here. There are plentiful opportunities for boys to engage with drama, from performing in plays or being part of a technical team and backstage crew, to writing their own plays and studying drama as an academic subject at both GCSE and A Level.

Drama is extremely popular across all year groups, both as an academic subject and a co-curricular activity. There are currently three classes in Years 10 and 11 studying Drama GCSE, and a healthy uptake at A Level. The Drama department delivers a dynamic programme of annual events, including the biennial College Musical/ College Play, year group plays, acting competitions and cups, and termly drama workshops, alongside GCSE and A Level performances. Other new initiatives include the founding of Shakespeare Shorts (an OX14 Partnership programme for Year 9), participation in the National Theatre New Views playwriting programme and hosting a National Youth Theatre audition day. The boys' talent and enthusiasm shines through in all their endeavours, most recently illustrated in 13 places awarded by the NYT, the cast of *Les Misérables* being invited to perform at the National School Theatre Awards, and Radley College being a finalist in the Muddy Stilettos Best School awards for Dynamic Performing Arts.

Radley College's 400 seat theatre is a wonderful and versatile performance space, equipped with modern technical resources, including intelligent lighting and a recently installed digital sound system. In addition to the theatre there is a black-box studio (used for smaller productions, classes and examination performances) and two drama classrooms for teaching.

The Drama department is a busy and dynamic environment; in addition to the Director of Drama there is a supportive team consisting of the Head of Academic Drama, a Drama Teacher, the Technical Theatre Manager, a Costume Designer and Costume Assistant, a Scenic Fabricator and a visiting LAMDA coach. All members of the academic team direct year group plays and are fully supported by the Theatre Team.



The Role

Drama and Theatre are integral to the life of Radley College, with a strong tradition of excellence. The Director of Drama is responsible for ensuring the highest standards of school performance while providing experiences, opportunities, and challenges for every boy.

The role encompasses overall responsibility for all drama productions at Radley, working closely with the Head of Academic Drama. The Director will teach a reduced timetable and oversee plays, partnerships, and competitions, ensuring a diverse and inclusive programme throughout the year. While maintaining the success of Musical Theatre and a balance of classical and modern repertoire, the post-holder will have flexibility to develop their own vision for the future of Drama at Radley.

The post would suit someone already directing drama in a school environment who seeks a new challenge but there is no requirement for prior school experience. Previous involvement in professional theatre will be an advantage. The post-holder would be expected to be an outstanding director and creative influence, with an interest in a broad range of theatrical genres. They would be required to have the excellent communication and management skills to build on the strong reputation Radley has for high quality in drama. They will have the dedication to ensure the highest of standards and the enthusiasm and energy to offer a wide range of opportunities for all levels of ability.

Safeguarding
