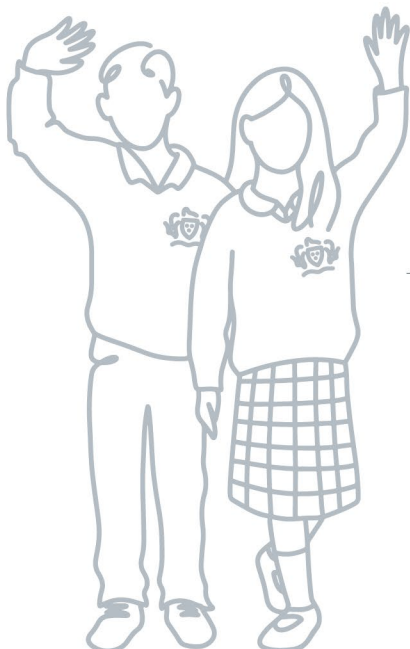

The *Department*

The Faculty of Modern Languages is a well-established, lively and successful department comprising twelve teachers and four language assistants. The Head of Languages is supported by separate Subject Heads for French, Spanish and German, which are offered at IGCSE with CIE and A level with AQA. All Year 7 pupils study 2 languages from French, German and Spanish.

All pupils will continue to study at least one modern foreign language at IGCSE as part of the core curriculum, with some students choosing to do two languages at IGCSE.

Our suite of classrooms is on the first floor of the main building, with the departmental office at its centre. This has teacher workstations and photocopying facilities. Each classroom is equipped with an interactive whiteboard, so that all our digitalised sound and video files can be used.

The school provides generously for departmental resources and, as well as course books and related pupil workbooks, we have subscriptions to a range of online resources, including Active Teach and Kerboodle, which complement our KS3, KS4 and A-level AQA courses. Lower down the school we use *Dynamo* for French, *Mira* for Spanish, and *Echt!/Echo 2* in German.

The department has an excellent record of examination results. The percentage of top grades at IGCSE is well above average for similar schools. A-level and Oxbridge success have been similarly impressive. In 2025, 60% of pupils achieved grades 8/9 and 89% secured grades 7/8/9. At A level, in recent years, the department has a 100% record of pupils achieving A*/A.

The department organises a variety of foreign language trips and exchanges annually for all year groups and across all languages. We recognise the significant value these experiences provide, offering language learners of all ages unique opportunities to enhance their language skills and cultural understanding.

There is a variety of support, extension and enrichment opportunities for all year groups in all languages. Students in Year 7-13 can enter translation competitions in French, German and Spanish. In the 6th form students take part in debating, translation and essay competitions. We organise theatre and cinema trips to London, invite guest speakers from industry to speak to our students about languages and offer the MFL leaders programme to our Year 12 students. We also facilitate access to university lectures in all languages.

Key *Responsibilities*

Below is a summary of the key responsibilities of the Teacher of German (Maternity Cover).

- To deliver subject curriculum to pupils
- Teaching pupils through the School at Key Stages 3, 4 and 5, including examined groups at GCSE and A Level
- To mark, assess and grade within the department, always setting the highest standards of personal organisation and administration
- To attend regular meetings of the department, both formal and informal, to discuss policy, teaching methods, approaches to the subject and the sharing of common problems and concerns
- Adhering to departmental policies and to meet School deadlines insofar as it applies to the department
- To assist in the induction of new staff into the department, where required
- To engage in ongoing professional learning, including an annual review

Responsibilities in relation to the pupils and to what is taught:

- To keep abreast of developments in the subject, maintaining contacts with professional associations
- To participate in discussion, within the department, on the development of appropriate syllabuses and schemes of work at all levels
- To develop new teaching and learning resources and sharing them with pupils and colleagues
- To ensure pupils are properly prepared for exams and entered for exams and overseeing course work
- To participate in the setting and marking of internal exams and determining appropriate grade boundaries thereafter
- To assist with trips and other co-curricular activities in relation to the department
- To give appropriate guidance to pupils who wish to study the subject at further levels
- To maintain the image of the subject as an interesting and valuable one. Keeping learning environments stimulating and interesting

Key *Responsibilities*

Responsibilities in relation to the School:

- To carry out School policy, including the School safety policy, in the context of the department
- To contribute to the co-curricular life of the school
- To communicate departmental matters to the Head of Department, discussing examination results and raising issues of concern
- To set and mark entrance exams and interviewing where necessary
- To support the use of ICT within the department
- To present the department at Open Days etc. as the need arises and in prospectuses
- To ensure that the facilities used by the department, including equipment and teaching areas, are maintained in an appropriate condition

All teachers are expected to contribute to our pupils' holistic development and the co-curricular life of the school, outside their timetabled day and beyond their curriculum subject. This may include events, training or rehearsals, for example, after school and at weekends, and running or staffing residential trips, as well as a standard expectation of regular clubs for both curriculum extension and the co-curriculum.

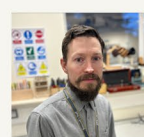
