

The *Department*

The Drama department at Bancroft's School is thriving, with increasing numbers of students taking it as an option throughout the year groups, culminating in A Level Theatre Studies. We have a flourishing co-curricular programme, including a House Performing Arts competition, weekly Junior Drama, two major productions per year for the Seniors and Juniors, alternating between plays and musicals, a playwriting club, and we support student-led productions throughout the year.

Currently, most lessons for Drama are taught in our Performing Arts Centre which is a large, flexible performance and rehearsal space with a sprung floor, split into two classrooms during the week. Each classroom has its own projector, connected to a computer with full sound and lighting capacities. This space is used for all our practical exams, enabling the students to perform in a range of audience configurations.

We have a theatre technician who oversees the tech in productions, runs tech clubs and teaches the exam classes the fundamentals of sound and lighting. We also make use of the Great Hall which has a proscenium arch stage and a lighting and sound desk, both for lessons and extra-curricular performance.





The Person

We are looking for an inspirational individual to teach drama in our highly successful Drama Department to cover a period of maternity leave. The successful candidate will be passionate about theatre in all its forms and be excited about joining a flourishing and ambitious department.

We take an academic approach to the subject and we would want our successful candidate to be able to stretch our high-ability cohort and, at Sixth Form level, prepare students to study Theatre Studies at Russell Group Universities. Instinctively professional, the candidate will join a thriving academic community committed to education in the broadest sense. The candidate will also be expected to fully commit to the co-curricular side of Bancroft's Drama, directing productions, taking theatre trips, and facilitating student-led projects.

Key Responsibilities

Below is a summary of the key responsibilities of the Teacher of Drama (Maternity Cover).

- To deliver subject curriculum to pupils
- Teaching pupils through the School at Key Stages 3, 4 and 5, including examined groups at GCSE and A Level
- Marking, assessment and grading within the department, always setting the highest standards of personal organisation and administration
- Attending regular meetings of the department, both formal and informal, to discuss policy,
 teaching methods, approaches to the subject and the sharing of common problems and concerns
- Adhering to departmental policies and to meet School deadlines insofar as it applies to the department
- Contribute to the co-curricular life of the school by directing at least one production
- Engaging in ongoing professional learning

Responsibilities in relation to the pupils and to what is taught:

- Keeping abreast of developments in the subject, maintaining contacts with professional associations
- Participating in discussion, within the department, on the development of appropriate syllabuses and schemes of work at all levels
- Developing new teaching and learning resources and sharing them with pupils and colleagues
- Ensuring pupils are properly prepared for exams and entered for exams and overseeing course work
- Participating in the setting and marking of internal exams and determining appropriate grade boundaries thereafter
- Assisting with trips and other co-curricular activities in relation to the department
- Giving appropriate guidance to pupils who wish to study the subject at further levels
- Maintaining the image of the subject as an interesting and valuable one. Keeping learning environments stimulating and interesting

Key Responsibilities

Responsibilities in relation to the School:

- Carrying out School policy, including the School safety policy, in the context of the department
- Contributing to the co-curricular life of the school
- Communicating departmental matters to the Head of Department, discussing examination results and raising issues of concern
- Setting and marking entrance exams and interviewing where necessary
- Supporting the use of ICT within the department
- Presenting the department at Open Days etc. as the need arises and in prospectuses
- Ensuring that the facilities used by the department, including equipment and teaching areas, are maintained in an appropriate condition

All teachers are expected to contribute to our pupils' holistic development and the co-curricular life of the school, outside their timetabled day and beyond their curriculum subject. This may include events, training or rehearsals, for example, after school and at weekends, and running or staffing residential trips, as well as a standard expectation of regular clubs for both curriculum extension and the co-curriculum.
