


# Thamesmead School

  3. Monitor individual student progress by using data and assessment procedures and by giving appropriate feedback to students, parents and line managers.

  5. Exploit opportunities to develop students' skills in ICT, literacy and numeracy and to contribute to students' personal, spiritual, moral, social, cultural development and race awareness.
