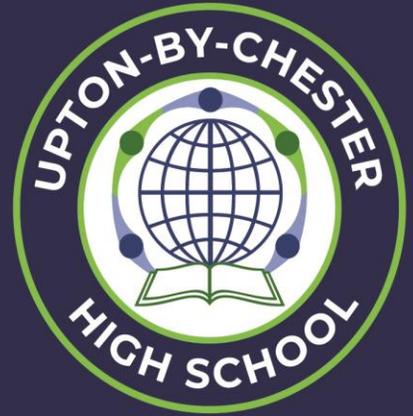

Welcome from the Headteacher

I would firstly like to thank you for your interest in a vacancy at Upton-by-Chester High School. The purpose of this information is to help you get to know more about our school and help you to decide if this is the right post for you.

Upton-by-Chester is a large and successful comprehensive secondary school located in Upton-by-Chester, an area on the outskirts of the wonderful city of Chester. Upton-by-Chester High School was established in 1968 and has gone from strength to strength over this time. We are a thriving, vibrant school with a proud record of academic excellence and success. Combined with our exceptional extra-curricular opportunities, we inspire our learners to flourish, no matter what their strengths and aptitudes. We are fully inclusive and open to young people of all abilities.

The school was inspected in February 2025. Inspectors found that;

"Pupils flourish in this school's nurturing and inclusive environment. Students in the sixth form are particularly appreciative of the school's support for their academic achievement and personal growth. Pupils develop positive relationships with staff. An exciting development for the school is being part of the School Rebuilding Programme. This means that between September 2025 and September 2028 the school will undergo a complete rebuilding programme to provide learners with brand-new indoor and outdoor facilities to support their learning. The school currently serves both the local community and an extended catchment area with learners attending the school from up to 40 individual primary schools.

There are currently 1750 learners on roll and the school is oversubscribed in a number of year groups. The school also has an outstanding Sixth Form (Ofsted 2015, 2019 and 2025).

Our school motto is 'Learning to Shape the Future'. This really does capture what is at the heart of the school. We ensure that every learner - whatever their previous attainment - will gain life-long enrichment and learning from the time they spend with us at Upton. Our approach is to provide opportunities that will capture the imagination of our learners and allow them to develop their knowledge, skills and understanding to be successful academically and socially. Job Description Classroom Teacher

Salary Range:	MPR/UPR as applicable
Reporting to:	The Headteacher, members of the Senior Leadership Team (SLT) and the Governing Body
Supervisory responsibility:	The post holder may be responsible for the deployment and supervision of the work of teaching assistants relevant to their responsibilities

Main purpose of the job:

- Be responsible for the learning and achievement of all learners in the classes taught ensuring quality of opportunity for all.
- Be responsible and accountable for achieving the highest possible standards in work and conduct.
- Treat learners with dignity, building relationships rooted in mutual respect, and at all times observing proper boundaries appropriate to a teacher's professional position.
- Work proactively and effectively in collaboration and partnership with learners, parents/carers, governors, other staff and external agencies in the best interest of learners.
- Act within, the statutory frameworks, which set out their professional duties outlined in the current *School Teachers Pay and Conditions Document and Teacher standards*.
- Take responsibility for promoting and safeguarding the welfare of children and young people within the school.

Duties and responsibilities:

All teachers are required to carry out the duties of a school teacher as set out in the current *School Teachers Pay and Conditions Document*. Teachers should also have due regard to the Teacher Standards. Teachers' performance will be assessed against the Teacher Standards as part of the appraisal process as relevant to their role in the school. (see Performance Management Policy).

Professional duties Teaching:

- Deliver the curriculum as relevant to the age and ability group/subject/s that you teach
- Be responsible for the preparation and development of teaching materials, teaching programmes and pastoral arrangements as appropriate
- Be accountable for the attainment, progress and outcomes of learners you teach.
- Be aware of learners' capabilities, their prior knowledge and plan teaching and differentiate appropriately to build on these demonstrating knowledge and understanding of how learners learn.
- Have a clear understanding of the needs of all learners, including those with special educational needs; gifted and talented; EAL; disabilities; and be able to use and evaluate distinctive teaching approaches to engage and support them.
- Demonstrate an understanding of and take responsibility for promoting high standards of literacy including the correct use of spoken English.
- Set challenging learning objectives for learners of all backgrounds, abilities and dispositions, monitoring learners' progress and levels of attainment
- Make accurate and productive use of assessment to secure learners' progress.

Job Description Classroom Teacher

- Give learners regular feedback, both orally and through accurate marking, and encourage learners to respond to the feedback, reflect on progress, their emerging needs and to take a responsible and conscientious attitude to their work and study.
- Use relevant data to monitor progress, set targets and plan subsequent lessons.
- Set homework and plan other out-of-class activities to consolidate and extend the knowledge and understanding learners have acquired as appropriate.
- Participate in arrangements for examinations and assessments within the remit of the *School Teachers' Pay and Conditions Document*.
- Providing or contributing to oral and written assessments, reports and references relating to individual learners and groups of learners.

Behaviour and Safety:

- Establish a safe, purposeful and stimulating environment for learners, rooted in mutual respect and establish a framework for discipline with a range of strategies, using praise, sanctions and rewards consistently and fairly.
- Manage classes effectively, using approaches which are appropriate to learners' needs in order to inspire, motivate and challenge pupils.
- Maintain good relationships with learners, exercise appropriate authority, and act decisively when necessary.
- Be a positive role model and demonstrate consistently the positive attitudes, values, and behaviour, which are expected of learners at Upton-by-Chester High School.
- Have high expectations of behaviour, promoting self-control and independence of all learners.
- Carry out duties as directed and within the remit of the current *School Teachers' Pay and Conditions Document*.
- Be responsible for promoting and safeguarding the welfare of children and young people within the school, raising any concerns following school protocol/procedures. Staff must engage in regular safeguarding training provided by the school or other approved agencies.
- Maintaining health and safety, good order and discipline when leavers are engaged in any offsite activities.

Team working and collaboration:

- Participate in any relevant meetings/professional development opportunities at the school, which relate the learners, curriculum or organisation of the school including pastoral arrangement and assemblies.
- Work as a team member to identify opportunities for working with school colleagues and sharing the development of effective practise with them.
- Contribute to the selection and professional development of other teachers and support staff including the induction and assessment of new teachers, teachers serving induction periods and where appropriate threshold assessments (line managers only).
- Ensure that colleagues working with you are appropriately involved in supporting learning and understand the roles they are expected to fulfil.
- Cover for absent colleagues within the remit of the current *School Teachers' Pay and Conditions* document.

Fulfil wider professional responsibilities:

- Work collaboratively with others to develop effective professional relationships.
- Deploy support staff effectively as appropriate.
- Communicate effectively with parent/carers with regard to learners' achievements and well-being using school systems/processes as appropriate.
- Communicate and co-operate with other schools and colleagues within Upton-by-Chester High School and relevant external bodies.
- Make a positive contribution to the wider life and ethos of the school.

Administration

- Register the attendance of and supervise learners, before, during or after school sessions as appropriate.
- Participate in and carry out any administrative and organisational tasks within the remit of the current School Teachers' Pay and Conditions Document.

Professional learning:

- Regularly review the effectiveness of your teaching and assessment procedures and its impact on learners' progress, attainment and wellbeing, refining your approaches where necessary responding to advice and feedback from colleagues.
- Be responsible for improving your teaching through participating fully in training and development opportunities identified by the school or as developed as an outcome of your appraisal.
- Proactively participate with arrangements made in accordance with current Appraisal Regulations.

Other:

- Staff must engage in regular safeguarding training provided by the school or other approved outside agency.
- To have professional regard for the ethos, policies and practises of Upton-by-Chester High School and maintain high standards in your own attendance and punctuality.
- Perform any reasonable duties as requested by the Headteacher.

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About the PE Department

The PE Department

The Physical Education department at Upton-by-Chester High School strives to build upon and embed the physical skills and understanding gained at KS2, looking to build confidence, competence and progress learner performances and knowledge towards expertise. This is desired across a range of sports and varying physical activities. Learners should develop an understanding of what makes a performance effective and how to apply these principles to their own and other learners' work, this theoretical understanding will provide the foundation for GCSE PE and Dance work.

It is hoped this deeper understanding will develop confidence and interest within learners, so to encourage greater active involvement in exercise and physical activity, in and out of school, and beyond school into later life.

About the PE Department

Key Stage 3

Learners are taught a wide range of physical activities, providing a thorough understanding of individual & team games, physical & aesthetic units, and outdoor adventure activities. Learners are encouraged to take on leadership roles in activities and the focus on these skills becomes greater as the key stage progresses.

Key Stage 4

All learners have core PE once a week, at this Key stage we build upon their knowledge & understanding from KS3 and develop their performances in a reduced number of physical activities. Greater emphasis is placed on the technical, tactic & compositional development of their performance. Leadership skill development becomes prominent at this key stage with learners taking on greater responsibility as coach or organiser. Learners choosing GCSE PE follow the AQA Specification, modules at KS3 build some understanding of unit 3 of the GCSE PE from which they can build on throughout the two-year GCSE course.

The course is assessed in two final exams (60%), practical performance of 3 sports (30%), and an analysis of performance coursework (10%).

Learners choosing Dance as an option at year 10 & 11 follow the Pearson BTEC Tech Award in Performing Arts with a Dance approach. The course gives learners the opportunity to develop knowledge and technical skills in a practical learning environment through 3 components: Exploring the Performing Arts (30%), Developing Skills and Techniques in the Performing Arts (30%), and Responding to a Brief (40%).

Key Stage 5

Learners follow the OCR Physical Education A Level Specification, building on knowledge and understanding from KS3 and KS4. The course takes learners through a wide range of subject areas including Anatomy, Exercise physiology, Sociology, Skill acquisition, Sport psychology, and analysis of performance & physical performance.

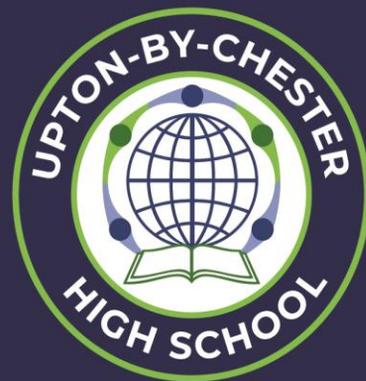
Completed applications should be returned no later than 27th February 2026.
