

Job Description - Nursery Practitioner

The Nursery Practitioner is expected to support the school's aims and ethos and to support the Nursery Manager in providing a safe, stimulating and effective learning environment, high quality teaching, and sensitive and appropriate pastoral care.

As directed by the Head, Head of Pre Prep/Nursery Manager, the Nursery Practitioner is expected to

- on first taking up appointment, follow through the school's induction programme
- abide by the terms of the contract of employment and staff handbook
- establish and maintain a good rapport with parents and colleagues
- be aware of and follow the school's academic policies, as well as policies on non-academic areas such as health & safety and equal opportunities
- attend training and preparation days, as appropriate
- assist with and attend whole school events such as Exhibition Day and the Summer Fete
- engage in staff liaison, preparation and clearing away, allowing time at the start and end of the working day to facilitate this
- encourage in the children, by example as well as instruction, courtesy and good manners
- assist with the supervision of children in the classrooms and outdoor areas
- assist with the planning, preparation and execution of class activities and clearing away of equipment
- hear individual reading, supervise group work, or lead a whole class activity such as reading a story, as directed by the Nursery Manager
- assist with all aspects of pupil assessment
- assume the role of key person for a group of children
- renew and maintain wall and other displays
- assist with the tidiness and good order of the Nursery and the maintenance
 of stock
- assist with walks and school journeys, within the normal Nursery day
- provide care and simple treatment for children who are unhappy or unwell, or who have suffered minor cuts or bumps
- provide first aid to children who are injured or ill
- assist with the toileting of children, where necessary
- clear up spillages and accidents
- become trained in first aid, asthma and anaphylaxis awareness
- become trained in food hygiene and positive handling
- promote and uphold British values in our work with pupils

In addition, the Nursery Practitioner is encouraged to

 attend training courses, paid for by the school, which will enhance expertise and awareness of educational issues
