We are currently recruiting for an individual to join our team of Domestic team who undertake cleaning related duties in our boarding houses and across the school site.

The Estates Department provides for a wide range of support activities related to the furnishing, cleaning and care of Gresham's buildings, grounds, sporting and other facilities.

We are currently recruiting for a motivated and enthusiastic individual to join the domestic team within the Estates Department. Reporting to the Estates Coordinator, you will be responsible for ensuring the timely and efficient completion of a variety of cleaning related tasks across the school site.

The ideal candidate will be a hardworking and reliable individual, who has the ability to work well as part of a team with a flexible 'can do' attitude. Understanding the importance of maintaining high standards and how to communicate effectively within a school environment are essential.

J O B O V E R V I E W

To provide a safe, clean and secure environment for the whole School community, ensuring that all areas are presented to a high standard at all times. The workload of the Domestic team is scheduled in advance by the Estates Coordinator in consultation with the Site Manager and will take into account all major School events that impact designated areas.

T A S K S A N D D U T I E S

- Be responsible for ensuring the cleanliness of your designated area and for maintaining high and consistent standards
- Take initiative to perform cleaning and tidying tasks that are not specifically contained within the rota but require attention as part of maintaining overall high standards
- Liaise with the Estates Coordinator and Site Manager and other members of staff as required to ensure the cleaning rota operates smoothly
- Report cleaning supplies requirements and stock levels to the line manager
- Ensure Health & Safety, quality and general procedure compliance, reporting any perceived hazards in the workplace
- To use all cleaning materials and equipment in a safe and proper manner and in accordance with any instructions and specifications provided
- Work as part of a team and support other members of the cleaning team to meet standards and school objectives
- To maintain good working relationships with other school staff and to co-operate with reasonable changes to daily work routines to assist the smooth operation of the school.
- Carry out the following duties:
 - Vacuum cleaning hard and soft floors
 - Spot cleaning of spillages
 - Wiping furniture, ledges, pipes, paintwork, doors and polishing door glass
 - Emptying and cleaning bins
 - Cleaning toilets including sanitary fittings and surrounds
 - Mopping and spray cleaning hard floor surfaces
 - Wiping and polishing and straightening furniture
 - Replenishing janitorial supplies in toilets etc.
 - Checking and closing windows, switching off lights after work
 - Completing an annual deep clean of classrooms, staffrooms, kitchen, dining areas, food tech areas and other frequently used spaces on school premises
 - Complete termly upkeep cleaning of classrooms, staffrooms, kitchen, dining areas, food tech areas and other frequently used spaces on school premises including high and low level dusting
 - Take responsibility of the maintenance of cleaning tools and products, including arranging replacements and ensuring good stock levels
 - Report all defects/hazards immediately to the Estates Coordinator / Site Manager/ Maintenance Manager
 - Such other duties as may be allocated from time to time
- To ensure that work undertaken complies with stated requirements and undertake appropriate training, as required
- Be prepared to cover cleaning duties across the School in order to cover staff shortages or peaks in workload
- On occasions and by advance agreement, be prepared to work outside of the yearly schedule when school facilities are being used by visitors/third parties

- Keep up to date with cleaning standards and instructions as laid down by the School and by health and safety regulations
- From time to time receive training via the Estates Department/Health & Safety Officer
- Promoting and safeguarding the welfare of children and young people in accordance with the school's safeguarding and child protection policy

The position gives the regular opportunity for contact with children and young people and is therefore classed as a regulated activity.

The role therefore requires the successful candidate to

- Read and understand the current Keeping Children Safe in Education (KCSIE) guidance, alongside the School's Safeguarding and Child Protection and demonstrate a commitment to implementing these fully, both in and out of the workplace
- Attending all Safeguarding training.
- Demonstrate a commitment to ensuring Gresham's is a safe environment through a sensitive and vigilant approach to working with young people, and to reporting all concerns.

As the School meets the requirements in respect of exempted questions under the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act 1974, your offer of employment will be subject to an enhanced disclosure from the Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) before the appointment is confirmed.

INTERVIEW PROCESS

If you are invited to attend an interview you will be required to complete a *Suitability to Work With Children Declaration Form* prior to interview and provide evidence of your identity on the day of your interview, from the following examples:

- A UK Birth certificate
- Passport and/or UK driving licence (including a photo-card);
- UK firearms licence;
- Evidence of your Right to Work status

- a utility bill or bank/building society statement showing your name and home address (less than three months old);
- Documentation confirming your National Insurance Number (P45, P60 or National Insurance Card);
- Original documents of educational and professional qualifications referred to in your application form.

If you have changed your name by deed poll or any other mechanism (e.g. marriage, adoption, and statutory declaration), you will be required to provide documentary evidence of the change.

For Teaching Posts: You will be contacted prior to your interview with the details of at least one teaching lesson that you will be expected to take. The interview process will involve a number of interviews with different members of staff and a tour of the School and/or department.

Support Posts: As well as a face to face interview, the selection process may include some other form of assessment e.g. administrative test, demonstration of practical skill, a presentation, etc.

Please note: Should you be successful following interview, you will be asked to provide documentation to assist in the processing of an Enhanced Disclosure (DBS). If you are on the DBS Update Service, you will be required to bring along the certificate that relates to this subscription.

Details of Online Profile: Keeping Children Safe in Education (KCSIE) asks schools to carry out online searches on shortlisted candidates as part of the process of assessing suitability. All candidates are therefore required to provide the following information as part of your application:
