In line with Keeping Children Safe in Education (KCSIE), online searches will be undertaken for all shortlisted candidates as part of the Trust's due diligence checks. These searches will be limited to information that is publicly available online and are intended to identify any incidents or issues that may be relevant to an applicant's suitability to work with children. Any concerns identified will be discussed with the candidate and explored further at interview.

This post involves regulated activity with children and is therefore exempt from the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act 1974. Applicants are required to disclose any cautions, convictions or other relevant information that are not protected under the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act 1974 (Exceptions) Order 1975 (as amended).

The successful candidate will be required to undergo an Enhanced Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check, including a Children's Barred List check. Further pre-employment checks, in line with Keeping Children Safe in Education and the Trust's Safer Recruitment procedures, will be completed before any appointment is confirmed. Where applicable, candidates who have lived or worked outside the UK will be required to provide a Certificate of Good Conduct or equivalent overseas criminal record check.
