Job description

Post Title:	Catering Assistant
Location:	Kenn Church of England Primary School (EX6 7TX)

Role Description

To assist with the catering service provided to Trust schools ensuring that the highest possible standards are achieved.

Responsibilities include:

- To ensure all aspects of relevant legislation are complied with, in relation to the Health and Safety at Work and Food Safety.
- Assist the Catering Manager and Assistant Catering Manager in the safe preparation, cooking and service of food to customers.
- All kitchen and dining room cleaning duties as per the rota.
- To assist in the provision of catering for special functions, outside normal working hours/holidays as requested.
- To ensure all food is at the correct temperature and standard before serving.
- To undertake additional duties during periods of sickness or planned holiday.
- Report faulty equipment and other maintenance requirements to appropriate person.
- Comply with school security arrangement i.e., securing entrances/exits as appropriate and reporting potential security breaches.
- Ensure lights and other equipment are switched off as appropriate.
- Be aware of and comply with policies and procedures relating to child protection, health, safety and security and confidentiality, reporting all concerns to an appropriate person.
- Be aware of the responsibility for personal Health, Safety and Welfare and that of others who may be affected by your actions or inactions.

- Cooperate with the employer on all issues to do with Health, Safety & Welfare including this as a standing item on departmental agendas.
- Promote the health, welfare and emotional well-being of all students.
- Promote equity of opportunity for all students and staff.

Working Environment & conditions of the post

- In support of the Trust's vision and ethos, the post holder may be required to travel and support staff at any school in the Ivy Education Trust.
- Ability to safely undertake the manual handling tasks required for the role, including moving, lifting, carrying, and storing food, equipment, and supplies in accordance with safe working practices and manual handling procedures*.
- Able to travel between work locations where public transport is not available each working day, and safely transport catering supplies, food items, equipment, and materials necessary for the effective delivery of the service.
- Occasionally be available to be on site outside normal working hours.
- The role requires periods of lone working.
- A full driving licence.

*Ability may be demonstrated through the available equipment, training, and reasonable workplace adjustments where required.

Other duties

- Through your work contribute positively to the reputation of the service.
- Contribute to site management improvement planning.
- To place the safeguarding of all children in the school as the highest priority.
- To be aware of and assume the appropriate level of responsibility for safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and to report any concerns in accordance with the Trust's safeguarding policies. We expect all staff to share this commitment and to undergo appropriate checks, including an enhanced DBS with barred list check.
- To make maximum use of opportunities to generate a culture of celebration and praise amongst the staff and pupils at our schools.
- To maintain an understanding of and work within Trust policies, procedures and statutory regulations, including in respect of health and safety, equity and inclusion, GDPR and data protection, safe use of IT, safeguarding children and safer working practices.
- To conduct oneself in a manner befitting a member of staff working in education at all times, demonstrating the behaviours and standards of our code of conduct.
- To carry out any other reasonable duties and responsibilities within the overall function, commensurate with the grading and level of responsibilities of the post.
- Working hours may be subject to variation to cover staff holidays and absences.

Please note – our Trust operates a Smoke-Free Policy, and all staff and workers are prohibited from smoking in any of the Trust buildings, Trust sites including enclosed spaces within the curtilage of buildings, and Trust vehicles.

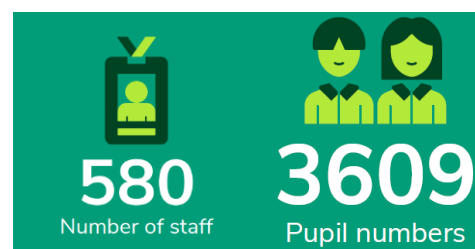

'Empowering futures; for a better tomorrow'

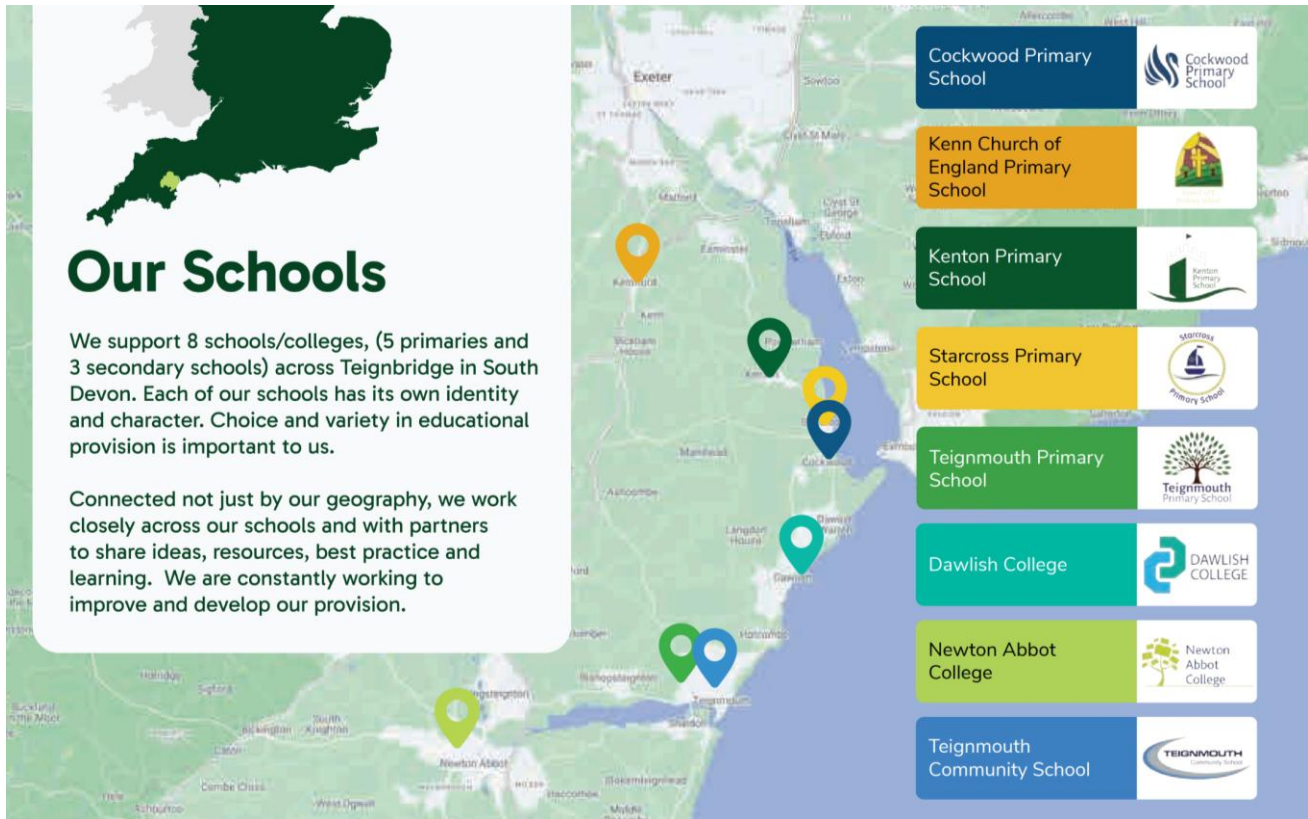
