Statement of Purpose

To work under the direct instruction of teaching staff, usually in the classroom with the teacher. Provide general support to the teacher in the care of pupils and management of the classroom. Work may be carried out in the classroom or outside the main teaching area. Assist teachers in the following:

Support to Teacher

- Provide structured support in accordance with specific work programmes designed and supervised by individual teachers.
- Support the SENDCo and teaching staff in the development and implementation of Individual Support Plans and Learning Passports.
- Assist in maintaining classroom discipline through the implementation of the school's behaviour management strategies.
- Provide support to pupils to achieve learning goals, e.g. precision teaching, comprehension intervention support.
- Assist the teacher in monitoring pupils' responses to learning activities and accurately record achievement/progress as directed.
- Provide detailed and regular feedback to teachers on pupils' achievement, progress, problems etc. Undertake appropriate basic admin tasks.
- Work with small groups/individuals as guided by the teacher to deliver aspects of lessons/schemes of learning.
- Take a register and add appropriate awards and sanctions on Arbor if required.

Support to Pupils

- Accompany teaching staff and pupils on visits, trips and out of school activities as required.¹
- Encourage pupils to interact with others and engage in activities led by the teacher.
- Assist children in matters of personal needs and their general health including first aid and welfare matters.
- Act as a link assistant to named SEND students to check on their welfare at least fortnightly.
- Provide general support to pupils ensuring their safety, by complying with good H&S practice.
- Help Serve food items such as toast or fruit & supervise children before, during and after snack time.

Support to Curriculum

- Assist the teacher in the preparation, development and delivery of agreed curriculum activities/materials.
- To provide support in literacy/numeracy/SEND strategies.
- Support the use of ICT in learning activities and develop pupils' competence and independence in its use.

Support to School (this list is not exhaustive and should reflect the ethos of the school)

- Promote and safeguard the welfare of children and young persons you are responsible for or come into contact with.
- Be aware of and comply with policies and procedures relating to child protection, health, safety and security, confidentiality and data protection, reporting all concerns to an appropriate person.
- Ensure all pupils have equal access to opportunities to learn and develop.
- Liaise effectively with teachers/parents/guardians, welfare officers, health visitors and other professional staff as part of the routine consultative process.
- Contribute to the overall ethos/work/aims of the school.
- Attend relevant meetings as required.²
- Participate in training and other learning activities and performance development as required. (See footnote 1.)
- Assist with the supervision of pupils out of lesson times, including before and after school and at lunchtimes.
