From first developing an application in 2007 to open schools in the new town of Northstowe, we have been committed to the vision of being an all-through and all-inclusive Trust. Our Trust currently consists of 36 schools, 19 primary schools, 13 secondary schools, 3 special schools and 1 all-through.

Meridian also plays a key role in the wider development of education in the region. We are the home to the Cambridge and Peterborough Teaching School Hub and operate a vibrant Initial Teaching Training provider that trains upwards of 100 teachers annually. In addition, our commitment to the local community as an extension of our village college ethos means that we host a range of activity in our schools, including providing leisure and educational opportunities.

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A Brief History

Meridian Trust, formerly known as Cambridge Meridian Academies Trust (CMAT), is a values-led Trust and has risen to be one of the highest performing academy groups in the country. Our Trust was first formed as an educational trust to create a federation of schools in 2006 with a desire to provide high quality and dynamic education for everyone, right in the heart of our community. Through various government policies, our commitment to collaboration has remained consistent.

Meridian Trust was formed in 2011 to deliver more widely on that clear vision to provide high quality and dynamic education for all at the heart of the communities we serve. Our steady growth since then reflects our commitment to the communities we serve and our track record of success. The period since 2018 has seen an increase in speed of growth as many long term projects matured and our relationship with Sharnbrook Academy Federation emerged.

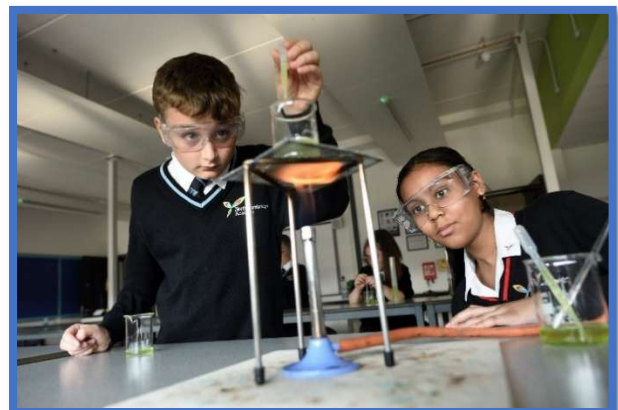
We are currently a family of 36 academies (including 19 primary, 3 special and 13 secondary schools and one all through school). The secondary schools include a University Technology College, an Upper School, four 11-16 schools and six 11-18 schools. We also have 2 new secondary free schools in development. All within 20 miles of Cambridge and Peterborough and the main communication routes between. We merged with Cambridge Primary Education Trust to become the Meridian Trust in April 2022. In addition to operating schools, we are the home of the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Teaching School Hub, and train more than 150 new teachers each year through Meridian Trust ITT. We retain a

strong commitment to growing and supporting staff throughout their training and career development. We have a proven track record of school improvement and transforming the lives of children and young people over the last 10 years.

Students thrive in Meridian Trust academies as a result of the implementation of our values, our successful and proven systems and our commitment to valuing people. We are among the highest performing multi-academy trusts in the country for student progress. Our academies are well-run and our staff benefit from excellent access to professional development.

Our commitment to the education system goes beyond just our own academies. We operate 'The Cambridge Partnership', one of the largest initial teacher training providers in the country which has recently merged with the SAF ITT, and 'Leadership East' these further strengthen our capacity and commitment to professional development. We also provide support through various SLAs to a number of other trusts and academies.

As a strong, regional multi-academy trust we currently operate schools across Bedfordshire, Cambridgeshire, Lincolnshire, Peterborough, and Northamptonshire. We are proud to have strong partnerships within all these communities.

Role:	To ensure finance teams comply with all internal and external financial regulations

Responsibilities and Accountabilities:

- Line management of Finance Officers:
- Preparation of academy or business unit budgets
- Preparation of month end accounts, year-end accounts and re-forecasts, including accounts for income generating activities e.g. gym, adult education, lettings etc.
- Meet with leaders on a regular basis to support budget tracking and planning processes
- Ensure all actions from Internal / External Audit reports have been implemented



- Closedown each set of accounts following review of month end reports
- Month end checks for all school accounts – ensure these are done, including Creditors, Debtors, Nominal ledger, Cash Book, Cash flow forecasts, Petty Cash, VAT and Control Accounts
- Monitor aged debt report and ensure that old debts are being chased
- Payroll checking / raise journals / track spending to forecasts, payroll reconciliation
- Payroll month end reports – completion of month end data sheets and year end records
- Produce quarterly termly reports in collaboration with relevant leaders
- Authorisation of Suppliers payments run
- Set up ad hoc payments via online banking system
- Maintain Fixed Asset register and monitor capital expenditure for their schools.
- Ensure as a system administrator that changes are made to the base data on PSF e.g. new supplier/change of bank details
- Ensure compliance with Trust Financial Administration & Control Handbook, accounting policies and procedures and that these are communicated effectively in the school for which they are responsible
- Monitor cash flow in each centre and raise awareness if spending needs to be controlled to remain within cash limits
- Support the DoF in external audit process, including providing supporting documentation when requested
- Submission of applications for funding including rates from the DfE and LA
- Verify postings for VAT return for the Trust
