

Ofsted - 2025

The Ofsted inspectors were with the school for two days in May, and during that time looked into every aspect of school life – from how the curriculum is built and delivered to how well supported the children feel academically and emotionally. The school was considered ‘good’ in all areas.



The report highlighted the following:

This is a happy school where pupils are enthusiastic about their learning. Behaviour in the school is calm and orderly. Pupils feel safe and well supported. The school takes great care to include all pupils in everything that it does. This includes pupils with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND).

Effective leadership provides a clear sense of direction. The school has high expectations for all pupils' achievement.

Pupils are attentive and enthusiastic learners, achieving well across the curriculum. They enjoy relevant and interesting learning activities.

The school enriches the curriculum to make learning exciting.

Children in the early years get off to a positive start in their learning. They engage well with activities, working and playing together. Staff are attentive to children's individual needs. They provide clear guidance to help children learn and practise new knowledge.

The school provides a well-designed personal development programme. Pupils have opportunities to broaden their horizons through a range of learning experiences. Parents and carers hold the school in high regard. They praise both the standard of teaching and the quality of pastoral care.



History and Legacy of Richard Hill



Richard Hill School was founded in 1715 by the then Rector of Thurcaston, Rev. Richard Hill. Our Founder desired that his school should prepare its scholars for life's opportunities and challenges. Richard Hill saw education as a balance between social, academic and religious learning. We still adhere to his guiding principles – they have served us well for nearly 300 years.

As a school we visit All Saints Church regularly for Collective Worship led by Reverend, Matthew Gough. We also welcome parents and families to celebrate Harvest, Christmas, Easter and our Year 6 leavers service with us.


As a legacy to the pupils of Richard Hill School the Richard Hill Charity was set up. Any pupil of the school up to the age of 25 can apply to the charity for support. this has included the support for PGCE courses, gap years and technology for pupils.

The legacy of Richard Hill is also continued with our support of two pupils at Alpha and Omega school in Uganda. Our Pupil Communication Team share and send updates of our sponsorship with the wider school community.





Curriculum



We use the following schemes of work to make our Richard Hill Curriculum engaging, exciting and inclusive for all!

Our curriculum has been structured very carefully from the Early Years to year 6 based on our changing class structure. Teachers are very knowledgeable, skilled and they work closely with subject leaders in other schools. As a result children at Richard Hill love learning. They are curious, joyful and resilient learners.

Whilst we have an excellent core curriculum we believe strongly in preparing children for life with a range of experiences as part of the wider curriculum including families and the community as much as possible.

Getting out and about

At Richard Hill the children will regularly visit church and they will go to an additional place of worship across the year. They will go on walks around the local area. There is one class trip a year and a whole school trip. Year 6 go on a residential each year.

School Events

Families are invited to a range of events across the school year including Christmas and Summer Fairs, school Open Events. We have class assemblies that celebrate a range of celebrations from all faiths and share the children's most recent work

Visitors

We have a range of visitors come into school every year including the Fire Service to talk about Fire Safety, the Dogs Trust, Leicester Riders to name a few.

In addition through the Charnwood Education partnership we have poets, historians, meteorologists and geologists visit our classes each year.

Additional Skills

The children learn basic first aid with a paramedic in years 5 and 6, they learn how to use a balance bike in EYFS and do Bikeability in year 6. We encourage our children to be advocates of areas of interest such as being on the Junior Ethos Committee. All our children have the opportunity to have music lessons.

Payments are made online and more details will be provided if you wish to book a place for your child. We also accept both employee scheme childcare vouchers and tax-free childcare vouchers.




Admissions

Richard Hill CE Primary School is a thriving and popular school serving the village of Thurcaston, Leicestershire .Our catchment area can be viewed on our website but we also welcome applications from outside this area and have many families in school from across the region.

We operate a single time admission for all children joining us at Foundation Stage. At the age of eleven, many of our pupils transfer to the following schools: The Martin High School, The Cedars Academy and Rawlins Academy.

Parents and carers need to apply for a place at our school via the local authority by mid- January and places are confirmed in April. It is important to apply on time to have the best chance of securing a place at your preferred school.
