About Abbey Woods Academy

Abbey Woods Academy is a mixed-gender primary academy for children aged 3 to 11, located in Berinsfield, Oxfordshire. The school serves its local community and currently has approximately 140 pupils on roll. The most recent Ofsted inspection judged the school to be Good in all areas (June 2023), with clear strengths identified alongside areas for further development, particularly in securing consistency in teaching and outcomes.

A significant proportion of pupils have additional needs, including those requiring SEN support and those with Education, Health and Care Plans. The school also serves a community with high levels of disadvantage, including families who may not always be visible through headline measures. This context shapes the school's strong focus on inclusion, pastoral care and targeted support.

Abbey Woods is characterised by its inclusive ethos and strong relationships between staff, pupils and families. The school is committed to continuous improvement, with a focus on raising standards, strengthening teaching and learning, and ensuring that all pupils are equipped with the knowledge, skills and confidence to thrive in the next stage of their education and beyond.

As a values-driven school, Abbey Woods is committed to nurturing the whole child. The curriculum is designed to be engaging, inclusive and aspirational, supporting pupils to develop confidence, independence and a love of learning.

There is a clear focus on creating a safe and supportive environment where every child is known, valued and encouraged to succeed.

We are seeking a Headteacher who will build on the foundations in place at Abbey Woods Academy, bringing clarity, consistency and a strong sense of direction. This includes embedding high expectations across all areas of the school, strengthening the culture of accountability, and ensuring that every pupil benefits from a high-quality, consistent educational experience.

A key priority will be re-establishing the school's position at the heart of the community, building trust with families and ensuring the school is visible, inclusive and outward facing.

Strategic priorities for the next Headteacher:

1. Secure consistently strong teaching and learning across all year groups.
2. Strengthen behaviour, routines and expectations to support a calm, purposeful environment.
3. Raise outcomes for all pupils, particularly disadvantaged pupils and those with SEND.
4. Build leadership capacity and develop a confident, accountable staff team.
5. Improve attendance and pupil engagement across the school community.
6. Rebuild and strengthen relationships with parents, carers and the wider community.
7. Establish a clear, compelling vision that secures long-term improvement and sustainability.

Future growth

The school is at an important point in its development, with a clear opportunity to strengthen its position within the local community. The incoming Headteacher will play a central role in shaping the next phase of improvement, ensuring that curriculum, staffing and resources are aligned to deliver sustainable, long-term impact.

We aim for Abbey Woods to become the school of choice for families in Berinsfield and the surrounding area, and the successful Headteacher will play a pivotal role in achieving this ambition. Working in partnership with strong trust wide support, the Headteacher will lead the school's improvement journey, strengthen community confidence, and drive the highest standards of education.

This is a strategic leadership responsibility, requiring a clear, future-focused approach that balances pace of improvement with a strong, inclusive school culture.
