Job Description

Main Purpose of Job

- To deliver a high-quality, flexible and evidence-based Speech and Language Therapy (SaLT) service for pupils aged 11–19 with complex learning needs, supporting communication, independence and preparation for adulthood.
- To work as part of a multidisciplinary team to provide high quality, holistic support for pupils and their families throughout their time at Alfriston School, fostering collaborative working with education staff, external professionals and families.
- To assess, diagnose and deliver speech and language therapy for pupils with learning disabilities and associated speech, language and communication needs, including individual interventions, scheduled social communication groups integrated into the curriculum, and specialist short- and long-term interventions identified by the SaLT team.
- To implement a balanced, integrated model of therapy (universal, targeted and specialist), embedding communication strategies and other therapeutic approaches across the curriculum and wider school life.
- To manage a defined caseload, deliver therapy programmes, contribute to Education, Health and Care Plans (EHCPs), and apply effective approaches to teaching and learning for pupils with complex and comorbid diagnoses including neurodivergence, language disorders and moderate learning disorders (MLD) within an educational setting.
- To deliver and participate in specialist training so that staff can support pupils to achieve their full potential.
- To reflect Alfriston's core values of Ambition, Respect, Representation, Integrity, Belonging and Curiosity, ensuring all pupils are empowered to communicate, participate and thrive.

Clinical Responsibilities

- Assess, diagnose and provide evidence-based intervention for speech, language and communication needs.
- Manage a defined caseload, set targets, monitor progress and outcomes, and adapt provision accordingly.
- Deliver individual and group interventions, including social communication programmes, and lead and support social groups and interventions as part of the integrated curriculum, including supporting therapy assistants in their delivery where appropriate.
- Use a functional, outcomes-focused approach to support independence and preparation for adulthood.
- Demonstrate expertise in assessing, diagnosing and managing communication difficulties in students aged 11–19, providing care plans and interventions tailored to individual needs.
- Contribute to and review EHCPs, including preparing high-quality SaLT reports for annual reviews and ensuring all legal and professional standards are met.
- Adhere to HCPC and RCSLT standards and Alfriston School policies, including clinical supervision, record keeping and professional practice.
- Make day-to-day clinical decisions, prioritise workloads, and seek guidance from the Deputy Headteacher for Inclusion and belonging as appropriate.
- Participate in clinical supervision and reflective practice, and work collaboratively with the multidisciplinary team to deliver integrated, holistic support for pupils.

- Deliver targeted training to education staff, support the integration of therapeutic strategies into daily practice, and monitor the effectiveness of that training.
- Communicate complex information effectively and sensitively with pupils, families and professionals, ensuring understanding and empathy.
- Maintain accurate, compliant and risk-assessed records, and address complaints sensitively while keeping senior staff informed.
- Contribute to service development, quality improvement and innovation by evaluating new intervention methods, participating in audits and reporting on service outcomes.
- Reflect on personal performance, participate in appraisals, and continue to develop knowledge and skills in speech, language and communication development.
- Collaborate with multi-agency services, including health and social care partners, and education staff to raise communication standards across the school.

Integrated Practice in Education

- Embed SaLT strategies in daily teaching and learning across the school.
- Work collaboratively with teachers, pastoral staff and therapists to deliver a joined-up approach and reduce barriers to learning and engagement.
- Train and coach staff to develop communication-friendly classrooms and inclusive environments.

Commissioned Therapies Service

- As part of Alfriston School's commissioned therapies provision, deliver Speech and Language Therapy services to external schools and provisions as commissioned.
- Undertake travel to other settings where required.
- Complete assessments, therapy programmes and reviews for commissioned pupils.
- Produce high-quality written reports and recommendations for external stakeholders.
- Maintain accurate records and meet agreed service-level expectations and timelines.
- Represent Alfriston professionally, modelling high standards of clinical and educational practice.

Communication

- Communicate effectively with young people, families and colleagues, adapting communication styles and strategies to meet individual needs.
- Build strong, respectful and trusting working relationships with pupils, families, colleagues and external professionals.
- Present complex concepts and information in a clear, accessible and audience-appropriate manner.
- Attend meetings including annual reviews, parent consultations and multidisciplinary team meetings, in consultation with the Deputy Headteacher for Inclusion and Belonging and other members of the Senior Leadership Team as applicable.
- Participate in school meetings related to curriculum, organisation or administration as required by the Headteacher.
- Support school events and activities, such as Parents' Evenings, as directed by the Headteacher.

Professional Practice and Development

- Work within HCPC and RCSLT standards and school policies.
- Engage in clinical supervision and reflective practice.
- Contribute to service development, quality improvement and innovation.
- Maintain accurate and compliant clinical records.

- Participate in CPD aligned to both clinical excellence and educational impact.
- Stay updated with developments in the field through relevant training, courses and professional development opportunities, participating in CPD aligned to both clinical excellence and educational impact.
- Undertake other reasonable duties as requested by the Headteacher to support the school's needs.
- Actively contribute to the wider life of the school.
- Promote and safeguard the welfare of children and young people at all times.
