

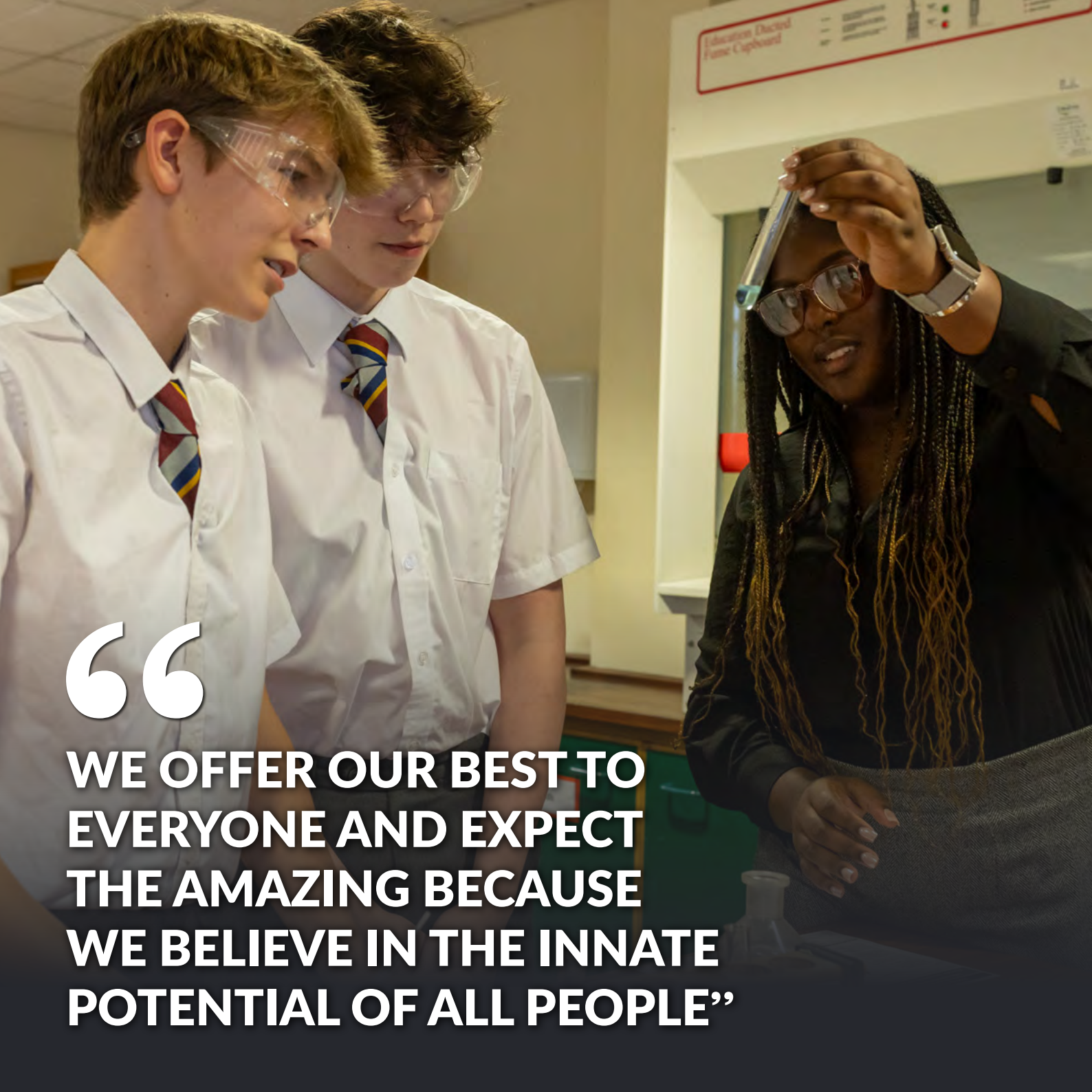

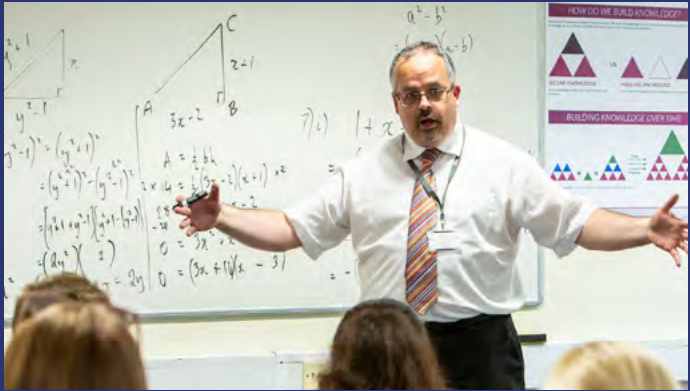
SUPPORT

We recognise that staff are our most important resource: they will have the biggest impact on the quality of education that our students receive. The Emmanuel staff body is an impressive group: well qualified, highly motivated and eminently hardworking. Colleagues are keen to continue developing their subject knowledge, pedagogical sophistication and classroom practice and the College is committed to doing all it can to support them in these endeavours.

The professional development of staff is a priority for us. All colleagues have access to a well-structured and high-quality CPL programme suited to their stage in their teaching journey and all teachers have the chance to pursue an NPQ through a national provider. Each member of staff has a line manager who is deeply interested in their wellbeing as well as their performance.

In addition to the normal remuneration package that includes a contributory pension scheme, company sick pay and maternity/paternity leave, Emmanuel staff enjoy a number of additional benefits. These include a daily lunch allowance, free use of our fitness suite, parking on the College grounds, as well as access to Care First, a free, independent and confidential resource available to employees that can help with all manner of needs.

There is a sense of real community amongst the Emmanuel staff body. Various social events sit alongside the long tradition of colleagues getting together after the College day to play football or netball – new players always hugely welcome!



THE DEPARTMENT

The Science Department consists of a hard-working and enthusiastic team of 15 staff, supported by three technicians, all committed to ensuring that every student in the College achieves their potential. The department has a strong tradition of expert classroom teaching, with effective internal communication and a collaborative atmosphere being key strengths of the team.

We are well equipped with ten laboratories, a wide range of specialist equipment, a tutorial room and a dedicated Sixth Form teaching space.

There are approximately 240 students in each year group from Years 7 to 11, with eight teaching groups in Years 7 and 8 and nine groups in Years 9 to 11. In Year 7, students are taught in mixed-attainment groups, which has proven to be a valuable transition approach for assessing foundational scientific knowledge from primary school. Throughout Key Stage 3, students continue to learn in mixed-attainment classes alongside targeted attainment groupings used for challenge, scaffolding and support. The department assesses students once every half term, with outcomes used to inform setting decisions and monitor individual progress.

In Years 7 and 8, students follow a Key Stage 3 programme of study closely aligned with the National Curriculum. Year 9 serves as a transition year in which students develop

key scientific concepts that are built upon during GCSE study in Years 10 and 11. Although Emmanuel is fully comprehensive, we are committed to entering all students for GCSE qualifications. Students study either AQA GCSE Biology, Chemistry and Physics (Separate Sciences) or AQA Combined Science.

Teaching Science at Emmanuel is both challenging and highly rewarding. Students value the subject and respond positively to the culture of high expectations. Authoritative teaching by subject specialists is a hallmark of the department, and we are proud of our contribution to the College's co-curricular offer through STEM Club, Space Club, Journal Club and participation in a range of science competitions.

Science options in the Sixth Form are extremely popular. We offer AQA A Level Biology, Chemistry and Physics, as well as the BTEC Level 3 National Diploma in Applied Science. As a department, we are passionate about nurturing excellence and sustained interest in science beyond Key Stage 4. Our challenging post-16 curriculum develops students' practical, analytical and mathematical skills alongside deep substantive knowledge. We also maintain strong links with local universities and alumni to further inspire and support our students.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

The Emmanuel College curriculum is designed to engage all students, no matter their background, in a broad and balanced range of subjects. Highly effective teaching and learning principles share our practice and are embedded within every classroom.

Our curriculum enables students to:

1. acquire the knowledge and cultural capital they need to succeed in life;
2. cultivate strong character and the intellectual discipline to apply their learnt knowledge correctly.

Emmanuel College is committed, for all students, to:

1. have access to an ambitious, coherent, knowledge-rich curriculum that allows all students to acquire and apply knowledge;
2. experience a straightforward delivery of said curriculum, supported by effective sequencing of topics with long-term learning at its core;

THE PERSON


The successful candidate will work within a team of subject specialists led by the Head of Science and supported by specialist curriculum leads. They will be expected to deliver the Science curriculum at Key Stage 3 and Chemistry at Key Stages 4 and 5. We expect applicants to be well qualified, self-motivated, adaptable and imaginative, and keen to join a team committed to achieving academic excellence for students aged 11–18 across a wide range of abilities.

Your motivation as a teacher will stem from a genuine commitment to the care and development of young lives. You will see children as individuals, each with unique abilities and potential, regardless of background, ability or behaviour. A high level of commitment to academic excellence, underpinned by strong subject pedagogy and consistently high standards of delivery, is essential. You will have the highest expectations of students, refusing to accept socio-economic disadvantage or special educational needs as barriers to success, and will demonstrate a natural authority in the classroom.⁷

You will aspire to be an outstanding teacher, combining mastery of your subject with strong relationships with young people and a confident grasp of the craft of the classroom.

There is no requirement for teachers to be Christians; however, it is essential that all staff understand and enthusiastically support the College's mission, ethos and values. There is a strong unity of purpose among the staff team, grounded in the shared belief that people are infinitely precious, gifted for a purpose and morally responsible. A desire to work with students from disadvantaged backgrounds and those with low academic starting points, alongside the most able and those from more privileged backgrounds, is a fundamental requirement.

- a commitment to raising student achievement;
- confidence in using technology, both within the classroom and beyond;
- willingness to participate in co-curricular activities;
- commitment to being part of our wider school community.
