# The Department

The Music Department at Bancroft's is thriving, with the majority of music-making taking place as part of our rich and varied co-curricular programme. Pupils of all ages actively participate in our outstanding provision of choral and instrumental music.

There is a wide array of ensembles to choose from, including Camerata, Concert Band, Rock Bands, Percussion Ensemble, Flute Ensembles, Soul Bands, Big Band, Girls' and Boys' Choirs, and Bancroft's Barbers, to name just a few. The Bancroft's Singers and the Bancroft's Sinfonia are the school's flagship choir and orchestra, performing a diverse and challenging repertoire.

Our co-curricular offering has been carefully curated to support and inspire pupils of all abilities, while also introducing them to a wide range of musical styles. These opportunities not only develop musical talent but also provide immense enjoyment for audiences at the many concerts held throughout the academic year. Many of our ensembles are led by specialist teachers who bring a wealth of professional experience in both performance and teaching.

The concert programme has expanded in recent years. Highlights of the musical calendar include an annual concert at Drapers' Hall and traditional Carol Services held in the School Chapel, which now benefits from a newly installed Viscount Envoy 35-F digital organ. Alongside our established Christmas and Spring Concerts, we now host an open-air Summer Music Festival at the end of the Summer Term, which brings together the entire Bancroft's community in celebration of music. For younger or less experienced performers, our informal Rush Hour Concerts provide a supportive platform to showcase their developing skills.

In partnership with the Drama Department, we also stage biennial senior and junior musicals, as well as an annual Inter-House Performing Arts Competition and a Choral Competition.

There are international tours for our orchestral and choral ensembles and pupils regularly perform at external venues, such as giving lunchtime recitals in the atrium of the Royal London Hospital. Many of these performers are part of our Music Enrichment Programme, which focuses on developing advanced performance skills and encourages chamber music-making with an emphasis on pupil-led rehearsals.

The Music Department is housed in the Adams Building. Facilities include a large rehearsal room on the ground floor, two classrooms on the first floor, one of which is equipped with a suite of iMac computers running Sibelius and Logic Pro and nine further practice rooms on the second floor, along with a dedicated music office. More than 600 individual music lessons take place each week across the Senior and Preparatory Schools, delivered by our team of 33 Visiting Music Teachers. 20% of those students take a second instrument. All pupils in Years 7 and 8 receive weekly music lessons. In Year 9, music becomes an option, and this academic year we have two groups at this level. We follow the Pearson specification for GCSE and the Eduqas specification at A Level.

The department is staffed by two full-time music teachers (including the Director of Music), one part-time teacher, and a part-time Technical and Administrative Assistant. The Assistant Director of Music oversees the academic music provision.

# Key Responsibilities

# Below is a summary of the key responsibilities of the Director of Music for the Senior School.

- Provide strategic leadership for the Music Department.
- Leading and inspiring the Music Department, promoting a culture of collaboration, creativity, and high achievement.
- Line manage the Assistant Director of Music (Academic Lead).
- Oversee the co-curricular music provision and liaise with the Deputy Head Operations and Co-Curricular.
- Ensuring outstanding teaching and learning across the department through coaching, mentoring, and professional development.
- Lead and manage departmental staff, including Visiting Music Teachers and the Administrative and Technical Assistant.
- Design and deliver a creative and ambitious programme of musical events throughout the academic year.
- Collaborate with colleagues and the Chaplain on regular events such as assemblies, Chapel services, and annual ceremonies.
- Work with the Director of Admissions, Marketing and Communications to promote music at Bancroft's to feeder schools and the wider community.
- Organise and adjudicate Music Award auditions (11+, 14+, 16+), and advise the Head on candidate suitability.
- Prepare and manage the departmental budget effectively.
- Liaise with the Director of Drama on musical productions.
- Work closely with the Director of Music in the Preparatory School to ensure continuity and collaboration.
- Teach Music across all year groups, as required.

## Other responsibilities in relation to the leadership and management of the department:

- Holding regular meetings of the department, both formal and informal, to discuss teaching and learning and the sharing of common problems and concerns. Ensuring that minutes are kept of formal meetings and shared with the Deputy Head Academic.
- Participating in the recruitment of new staff and ensuring that new staff are properly inducted into the department.
- Allocating teaching within the department and delegating responsibilities to teachers within the department.

- Producing a departmental handbook, which is regularly reviewed and updated. Consideration should be given to departmental policy, any changes of syllabus and schemes of work and the management and improvement of the department's resources.
- Ensuring that departmental policies are adhered to and that members of the department keep to the School policy and deadlines which relate to the Music department.
- Holding an annual review with each member of the department and feeding into the school review process.
- Encouraging and making provision for the professional development of staff.
- Managing the department budget, ensuring that resources are efficiently allocated.

#### Responsibilities in relation to the pupils and to what is taught:

- Keeping abreast of developments in the subject, maintaining contacts with professional associations.
- Participating in the setting and marking of internal exams and determining appropriate grade boundaries thereafter.
- Planning and leading academically enriching trips and other co-curricular activities in relation to the department.
- Giving appropriate guidance to pupils who wish to study the subject at further levels, including at the most competitive universities and conservatoires.
- Maintaining the image of the subject as an interesting and valuable one.

#### Responsibilities in relation to the School:

- Managing the department budget, ensuring that resources are efficiently allocated.
- Carrying out School policy, including the School safety policy, in the context of the department
- Contributing to the co-curricular life of the school.
- Communicating departmental matters to the Deputy Head Operations and Co-Curricular, discussing examination results and raising issues of concern.
- Setting and marking entrance exams and interviewing where necessary.
- Supporting the increasing use of ICT within the department.
- Presenting the department at Open Days etc. as the need arises and in prospectuses.
- Ensuring that the facilities used by the department, including equipment and teaching areas, are maintained in an appropriate condition.

All teachers are expected to contribute to our pupils' holistic development and the co-curricular life of the school, outside their timetabled day and beyond their curriculum subject. This may include events, training or rehearsals, for example, after school and at weekends, and running or staffing residential trips, as well as a standard expectation of regular clubs for both curriculum extension and the co-curriculum.
