Job Description

Post: Educational Support Assistant

Purpose

To work under supervision, direction and guidance of the teaching staff. Assisting the teacher(s) in the overall delivery of the Curriculum and undertake work/care/support programmes to enable access to learning for all students in the classroom

- Constantly uphold and promote our values and vision.
- Work directly with the SENDCO and team to ensure effective provision.
- Provide students with clear behaviour expectations and ensure our system of sanctions and rewards is firm and fair.
- Work with the teacher to ensure that progress is clearly recorded and relates to the learning objectives/goals for students.
- Assist with the organisation and supervision of playtime and lunchtime activities.
- Supervise activities and assist with the general management and care of pupils in the school, including during transitions and outdoor play
- Support the development of pupils' social skills, independence, and emotional wellbeing.



- Work with individuals or small groups to deliver interventions that meet the needs of pupils and comply with the recommendations of their support plans/EHCPs.
- Prepare and organise resources for learning activities, including displays and classroom materials
- Assist in the supervision of educational visits and local walks, ensuring the safety and wellbeing of pupils.
- Respond to the needs of all students with a sense of urgency
- Liaise with relevant staff to ensure all students' needs are met
- Manage own workload and that of others to allow an appropriate work / life balance.
- Work in effective partnership with other leaders in the Trust.
- Support students throughout the day by fulfilling pastoral responsibilities.
- Communicate effectively with parents and carers as directed by the teacher or school leadership.
- Engage fully in the academy appraisal process to fulfil personal potential and be able to participate effectively in the implementation of the academy's goals and improvement plan.
- Attend meetings / training and carry out administrative tasks and duties as specified on the academy calendar.
- Consistently implement all academy policies.
- Contribute to decision-making and consultation procedures.
- Report any safeguarding concerns immediately to the Designated Safeguarding Lead.
- Carry out any other reasonable duties as requested by the Headteacher or Head of School.
