Dear Applicant,

I am delighted that you are interested in applying to be Head of Religious Education at Emmanuel College.

We truly believe that Emmanuel College is a fantastic and exciting place to study as a student and work as a teacher. We are looking for a candidate who believes that Religious Education is an essential, stimulating subject, which asks the ultimate questions on which all other subjects are based – the “queen of the sciences”, as Thomas Aquinas said. Accordingly, Religious Education is to be taught passionately, making strong links to other subjects, and to the world of today.

At Emmanuel, we are extremely proud of our Religious Education curriculum, and have sought to get just the right balance of breadth and depth, to ensure students are confronted with different truth claims that stretch their minds and challenge their hearts. We passionately believe in education that prioritises the development of character; while our exam grades are excellent, we are most excited about nurturing our students to be curious, resilient, reflective and confident persons. We aim to show them how religion, particularly Christianity, has made the Western world that we live in, but also to understand and respect a plethora of different global worldviews and cultures.

All students in KS4 at Emmanuel College take RE GCSE and we have a strong uptake at A Level as well. This demonstrates the importance we place on the subject in the school today.

As a head of department you would have the opportunity to share your opinion and input into a wide range of issues across College, working closely with senior colleagues. We believe that heads of department should have the autonomy they need to lead their department and that they should be fully supported to do this by giving them a line manager who understands their department and subject well.

The Head of RE is also a role in which we would expect the successful candidate to contribute to our daily act of worship, Good Morning Emmanuel, being part of the team that delivers the daily ‘thought’, and be a key member of staff in ensuring the continued strengthening of our generous and inclusive Christian ethos.

Emmanuel College is a truly exceptional school, with excellent leadership, teaching and support for our students. As a Christian-

ethos school of character for the whole community, everyone is welcome whatever their educational background and ability, faith position, social or ethnic background. Student behaviour is excellent, and we put a great deal of emphasis on ensuring that staff can work in an environment where students want to learn. These high standards are maintained because of a relentless commitment to expectations and routines and so each teacher should be enthusiastic about upholding these. 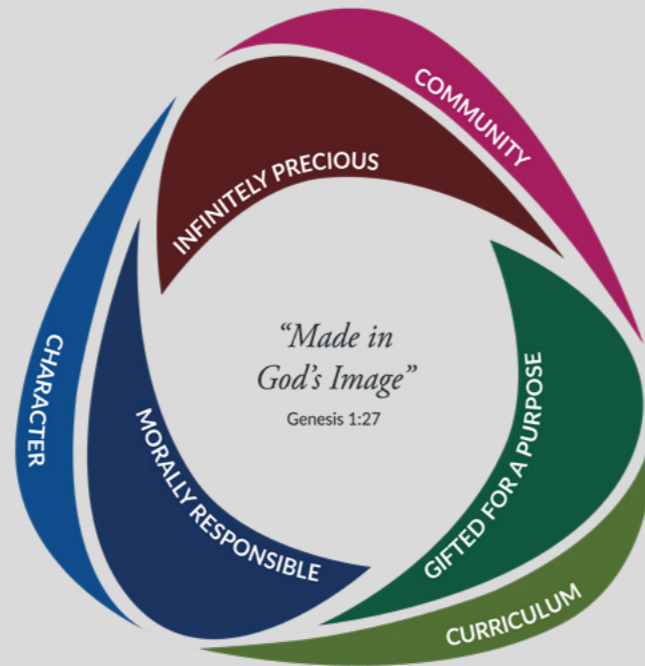

SUPPORT

We recognise that staff are our most important resource: they will have the biggest impact on the quality of education that our students receive. The Emmanuel staff body is an impressive group: well qualified, highly motivated and eminently hardworking. Colleagues are keen to continue developing their subject knowledge, pedagogical sophistication and classroom practice and the College is committed to doing all it can to support them in these endeavours.

The professional development of staff is a priority for us. All colleagues have access to a well-structured and high-quality CPL programme suited to their stage in their teaching journey and all heads of department have the chance to pursue an NPQLT qualification through a national provider.

As a line manager, you will play an important role in overseeing the wellbeing, as well as performance, of your staff. This is also the case for our heads of department:

you will have a line manager from the senior team who is deeply interested in you, your welfare as well as your development. Furthermore, the Head of Maths benefits from the sense of collegiality and stimulation provided by membership of the College's Wider Leadership Team.

In addition to the normal remuneration package that includes a contributory pension scheme, company sick pay and maternity/paternity leave, Emmanuel staff enjoy a number of additional benefits. These include a daily lunch allowance, free use of our fitness suite, parking on the College grounds, as well as access to Care First, a free, independent and confidential resource available to employees that can help with all manner of needs.

There is a sense of real community amongst the Emmanuel staff body. Various social events sit alongside the long tradition of colleagues getting together after the College day to play football or netball – new players always hugely welcome!



THE DEPARTMENT

We are a hardworking and enthusiastic team of six staff who are committed to character and academic excellence. We are all passionate about our subject, and work together to ensure we teach stretching and interesting content in an engaging and challenging way.

All students at Emmanuel College have two lessons of Religious Education a week in Years 7-10, and three a week in Year 11. Our curriculum is worldview based and draws out our desire that students reflect upon their own worldview while exploring the worldviews of others. We seek to draw links between these worldviews and practice – what it is that makes people live differently. Furthermore, students are to understand how history has shaped religious belief and practice, and how religious belief and practice shaped history, affects the world today, and could affect the future, whether this is with regard to geopolitical conflicts, human rights, or sexual ethics.

Religious Education classrooms at Emmanuel College are to be lively, hives of discussion, where all students are encouraged to contribute and share and debate views. They are also to be focused, with excellent written work being produced, beyond that which a student might feel they are capable of when they first begin their religious education journey.

Many students opt to take A-Level Religious studies, and we have built up a great deal of expertise in Philosophy, Ethics and New Testament. Students are highly engaged and diligent, and there is an opportunity to strongly challenge perceptions and stretch minds through high quality debate and discussion.

All members of the department are expected to contribute to leading our daily act of worship, Good Morning Emmanuel.

THE **ROLE**

Responsible to the Vice Principal (Quality of Education) for:

The rapid progress and exceptional academic achievement of all students in Religious Education with a particular emphasis on:

- being a visible example of our ethos, core virtues and leadership expectations that we hold, and through this contributing actively to Good Morning Emmanuel;
- ensuring decisions are driven by quality of provision and student progress data;
- building a cohesive staff team where the development of staff as teachers (both subject knowledge and quality of instruction) and leaders (career development and succession planning) is a core part of your practice.

Implementing an exceptional Religious Education curriculum and providing opportunities for students to grow in character with a particular emphasis on:

- working in collaboration with colleagues within Emmanuel and the multi-academy trust to align with our cross trust aims and principles, ensuring that our KS3 provision is embedded in the religion and worldviews approach and an exceptional experience for our students;
- ensuring the curriculum contains a clear progression from KS2 to KS5 and beyond and that all staff can articulate what is taught, why it is taught at that point in the curriculum and what it will lead to next for the students;
- implementing schemes of work that clearly define the substantive and disciplinary knowledge and vocabulary that students need to master and which lead to consistently exceptional teaching; while building meaningful curriculum links to a wide range of enrichment opportunities to engage all groups of students and build their cultural capital.

Ensuring that the teaching of Religious Education is consistently exceptional with a particular emphasis on:

- ensuring that schemes of work and lesson resources support consistently exceptional teaching and are regularly reviewed/improved through collaborative planning;
- leading regular quality assurance of effectiveness of teaching across the department, continually identifying examples of best practice to be disseminated and areas for improvement to be addressed through collaborative planning and support;
- creating a culture of reflective practice and improvement and professional dialogue across your team so that staff are motivated and supported to develop their own skills and subject knowledge, and to support each other.

- excellent people skills with the ability to build long-term relationships;
- strong communication skills and high levels of literacy;
- excellent organisational skills;
- high energy levels and a willingness to work hard;
- confidence in using technology, both within the classroom and beyond;
- willingness to participate in co-curricular activities;
- commitment to being part of our wider school community.
