<b>Core Responsibilities</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• To develop schemes of learning and resources for Humanities</li><li>• To teach Humanities across the age and ability range</li><li>• To prepare students for external examinations and assessments as directed by the Director of Humanities</li></ul>	
<b>Key Tasks</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• To mark and assess students' work according to the school/faculty policies</li><li>• To attend and contribute to relevant meetings</li><li>• To play an active part in the long term development of the Faculty</li><li>• To prepare students for external examinations and assessments as directed</li><li>• Ensure SOL are in place, shared with staff and reviewed annually</li><li>• Ensure regular assessments are in place and are used to inform Academic Profiles</li><li>• To monitor student progress including data analysis and, where appropriate put in place intervention</li><li>• To play a full part in the allocated Year Group Team – including carrying out duties as a Form Tutor, if appropriate</li></ul>	
<b>Other Responsibilities</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• To undertake an appropriate programme of teaching in accordance with the duties of a main scale teacher</li></ul>	
<b>Safeguarding</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• To ensure that all students have a safe environment in which they can learn, reporting any concern about the environment to a member of the site team or if appropriate to one of the Designated Safeguarding Leaders.</li><li>• To be aware of systems which support safeguarding and following the procedures as highlighted in the Safeguarding Policy</li><li>• To identify children who may benefit from early help as soon as possible and discuss this with one of the Designated Safeguarding Leaders</li><li>• To consider at all times what is in the best interests of the child</li><li>• To protect children from maltreatment; preventing impairment of children's health or development; ensuring that children grow up in circumstances consistent with the provision of safe and effective care</li><li>• To take action to enable all children to have the best outcomes</li></ul>	
<b>Other Specific Duties</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• To continue personal development as agreed.</li><li>• To engage actively in the performance review process.</li><li>• To undertake any other duty as specified by the School Teachers' Pay and Conditions Document not mentioned in the above.</li><li>• Whilst every effort has been made to explain the main duties and responsibilities of the post, each individual task to be undertaken may not be identified.</li></ul>
