Leicester Grammar School

In 2024 Leicester Grammar School was recognised as East Midlands Independent Secondary School as well as East Midlands School of the Year for Academic Performance by the Sunday Times. Further to this, the school was shortlisted as one of eight finalists for the TES Independent Senior School of the Year award and, most recently, for Independent School of the Year for Student Well-being.

Indeed the importance of pupils' well-being was seen as a significant contributory factor to the school's success in the last inspection of January 2024.

The success of our community stems, above all, from a culture of aspiration and care for our 850 pupils, all of whom enjoy exceptional opportunities within and beyond the classroom.

The Computing Department

The Computing Department at LGS is a thriving, highly successful and popular area of the curriculum. We recognise that digital literacy, computational thinking and programming skills are essential for pupils' future academic and professional success, and we are committed to providing an innovative and engaging learning experience.

Computing at LGS extends far beyond the classroom. Our curriculum is designed to develop confident, creative and independent learners through the practical application of a broad range of software tools and programming languages. Real-world projects and problem-solving tasks underpin learning, helping pupils develop independence, resilience, teamwork, enterprise and effective time-management skills.

The Department delivers a carefully structured programme across Years 6 to 9, blending Computer Science theory with practical programming and digital skills. Every lesson incorporates hands-on learning, enabling pupils to apply their knowledge in meaningful ways. From introducing computational thinking and core ICT skills in Year 6 to providing an academically rigorous and practically focused Computer Science programme in Year 9, our curriculum equips pupils with the foundations needed for future success.

Computer Science is a popular option at both GCSE and A Level. At GCSE, pupils follow the AQA Computer Science (8525) specification across two teaching sets. In 2026, 60% of grades were awarded at 9-7, with 44% achieving the highest grades of 9-8. At A Level, pupils study AQA Computer Science (7517), and the subject continues to attract increasing numbers of students each year, reflecting both the quality of teaching and the School's ongoing investment in the Department. Recent A Level results have seen a 100% A*-C pass rate, including 100% A* grades in 2023.

The Department is housed in three dedicated teaching spaces. Two Computing classrooms each contain 25 networked PCs, a colour laser printer, scanner and interactive display screen. A third specialist classroom, primarily used for A Level teaching, is equipped with 16 PCs, a colour laser printer and an interactive display screen. The Department office and teaching rooms are located in a spacious area overlooking the playing fields and form part of the Art and Design corridor.

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We are seeking an outstanding, enthusiastic and forward-thinking educator to join LGS as Head of Computing. This is an exciting opportunity to lead a successful department and play a key role in shaping the future direction of Computing and Computer Science across the School.

This position would suit either an experienced Head of Department seeking a new challenge or an ambitious and talented Computing teacher ready to take the next step into leadership. The successful candidate will inspire pupils aged 10-18, fostering a passion for Computing while maintaining the high standards and strong outcomes for which the Department is known.

The successful applicant will be an inspirational classroom practitioner with excellent subject knowledge and a clear commitment to delivering outstanding teaching and learning at all key stages. They will be expected to teach Computing and Computer Science up to and including A Level and to lead the continued development of a dynamic and engaging curriculum.

We are looking for a candidate with strong organisational and communication skills, a passion for innovation and a commitment to providing an exceptional educational experience. They will possess the ability to lead, motivate and inspire pupils and promote high expectations and academic excellence.

Applicants should have strong practical programming expertise, including proficiency in Python and experience of teaching programming to A Level standard. Knowledge of object-oriented programming, SQL and functional programming concepts is essential. Experience of additional languages and technologies such as C#, Java, PHP or Visual Basic would be advantageous, alongside an interest in emerging areas such as robotics, artificial intelligence and cybersecurity.

Most importantly, we are seeking a passionate educational leader who shares our commitment to excellence and who will inspire the next generation of digital innovators, problem-solvers and computer scientists.

As Head of Computing the successful candidate will have overall responsibility for the Computing Department at Leicester Grammar School, ensuring exceptional progress and outcomes for our pupils.

Job Description

Leadership of staff

- Lead the department to the highest standards of professionalism as a role model for colleagues and pupils across the school.
- Lead an effective departmental team with a strong sense of purpose in which responsibilities are appropriately allocated, devolved and shared.
- Take the lead on delivering high quality teaching and learning within the department.
- Oversee the allocation of teaching for departmental colleagues, ensuring teachers have both schemes of work and access to high quality teaching resources.
- Assist departmental staff in their professional development including leading and organising CPD.
- Chair department meetings which enable all staff to contribute to planning and ensure that records of such meetings are kept and distributed accordingly.
- Keep staff informed of curriculum developments and of thinking on whole school issues.
- Take a lead on matters of Computing among the school community at large.
- Monitor and evaluate the work of the department: conduct lesson observations, development review and regular work scrutiny.
- Lead, in consultation with the line manager, on staff recruitment.

Leadership of pupils

- Lead delivery of a stimulating and varied curriculum, designed to maximise pupils' engagement with Computing and ensure they make excellent progress and achieve excellent outcomes.
- Lead and coordinate the arrangement of a wide range of inspiring internal and external events, designed to support ongoing pupil engagement and enthusiasm.
- Monitor pupils' involvement and progress in Computing.

- Lead departmental involvement in school events, including Open Days and parents' evenings.
- Support and encourage pupil leadership in class and across the department.
- Ensure clear provision is made for pupils of different abilities, including the most able and those who find the subject challenging.

Departmental responsibilities

- Work closely with other colleagues to ensure that the vision for Computing is coherent throughout the school, and also the Trust.
- Develop and maintain the Department Development Plan.
- Ensure the departmental schemes of work are regularly reviewed and updated.
- Monitor, review and evaluate departmental plans and strategies.
- Manage the departmental budget.
- Teach Computing across Leicester Grammar School from Key Stage 3 to A-Level.
- Attend and contribute to the Heads of Department Committee.
- Implement Health and Safety Regulations as they apply within the department; ensure that statutory procedures for safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children are followed.
- Provide the point of contact on all departmental matters for pupils, staff parents and outside agencies.

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Leicester Grammar School Trust schools are easily accessible from the nearby city of Leicester, the market town of Market Harborough, and beautiful East Midland villages such as Great Glen. Although situated in the scenic countryside, we are an easy 30-minutes drive from the M1 and from nearby rail stations, London St Pancras can be reached in around one hour.

The school operates a comprehensive bus service which enables a large number of pupils to travel to and from school each day.

The campus has extensive facilities; well-equipped specialist classrooms, library, science laboratories, music rooms, and both indoor and outdoor sports facilities. We have an on-site café for use by staff and sixth form pupils as well as a bespoke study area for sixth form.

Safeguarding

Leicester Grammar School Trust is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and young people, and expects all staff and volunteers to share this commitment.

Applicants must undergo safer recruitment checks, including checks with past employers, online searches and the Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS). This role involves engaging in regulated activity relevant to children, it is an offence to apply for the role if you are barred from engaging in regulated activity relevant to children.

This role is exempt from the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act 1974 and the Trust is therefore permitted to ask you to declare all convictions and cautions (including those which would normally be considered "spent") in order to assess your suitability to work with children.

If you are successful in being shortlisted for this role, you will be required to provide information about your suitability to work with children by completing a self declaration form. In this form you will be required to provide details of all spent and unspent convictions and cautions. However, you will not have to disclose a caution or conviction for an offence committed in the United Kingdom if it has been filtered in accordance with the DBS filtering rules.





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
