

Internships

As part of an internship at St John's, you may experience:

- Structured professional development sessions on subjects such as behaviour management, safeguarding etc.
- Job shadowing and lesson observations.
- Have a tutor group.
- Supporting struggling pupils.
- Supporting pupils with SEND.
- Running departmental or school projects.
- Helping out with whole school events e.g. year 7 open day or sports day.
- Setting up and helping with experiments or lab work.
- Teaching a lesson.

Whether you're curious about teaching or seriously considering it, a Teaching Internship offers an inspiring and supportive way to explore the profession.

Eligibility

- You must be an undergraduate (in **at least** your second year of study) or master's student.
- You must be studying a university course related to the subject you wish to teach (Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Computing, Design & Technology or Languages (French, Spanish or German.)
- You must demonstrate a genuine interest in working with young people and making a positive difference to their lives.

Unfortunately, you are not eligible to apply if you are a first-year undergraduate, have applied for Initial Teacher Training (ITT) or have previously participated in a DfE funded Teaching Internship.
