We are looking for someone who will embrace the ethos of the school and the successful candidate will demonstrate a commitment to driving up behaviour standards and inspiring the same in others. They will have an unshakable belief in every student's entitlement to the highest-quality education and their ability to achieve and learn, whatever their personal circumstances.

The successful candidate will have:

- The ability to engage positively and build working relationships with a wide range of young people and their families
- The ability to encourage positive and respectful student behaviour
- An awareness of de-escalation procedures and positive behaviour management strategies

- The ability to work effectively as part of a team with teaching staff and outside agencies
- Excellent interpersonal, written, and oral communication and presentation skills

- An awareness of and a willingness to become trained in the principles of the Restorative practice approach to positive behaviour management
