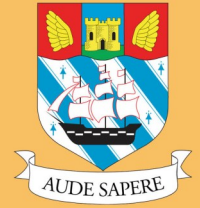

## HEAD OF YEAR AT TGGS

The role of Head of Year at our school is hugely fulfilling and rewarding. 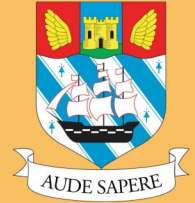
## CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

At Torquay Girls' Grammar School, all staff have access to a wide range of Continued Professional Development (CPD).

You will have formal opportunities to discuss your personal development goals with your line manager throughout the year. Furthermore, we have a generous budget which has supported individual CPD requests from staff across the school. Staff have completed a range of qualifications including Masters and National Professional Qualifications (NPQs). Alongside this, our INSET programme has included visits to other schools and research informed practice sessions led by staff, for staff, focussed on teaching and learning. All staff also have access to a wide range of online courses through National College.



# WORKING AT TGGGS



Being part of the 'TGGGS family' is special in many ways. Whatever role you play within the school community, there is so much that makes TGGGS a great place to work.

Our school is situated on a great site with fantastic facilities including our lecture theatre, Sports Hall, and a fully kitted gym suite which staff can access. Across the year, there are also opportunities to join staff only clubs including yoga and badminton; staff walks on Dartmoor and our annual sponsored walk which raises £1000s for charity - a great way to keep fit and socialise with colleagues!

Sports Day, Christmas Events, the House Shout and the Lip Sync Battle are some of the highly anticipated dates in the calendar, and staff also have the opportunity to be part of our extra-curricular offer by going on a range of trips.

Our Parents and Teachers Association (PTA) organises events for both staff and students, with our Quiz Night always proving a big success. Whether you would like to be part of the PTA or simply come along to the events for some fun, it is a great way to get involved with fundraising for the school.

As a new member of staff, you will receive a full induction to the school which continues beyond your first week, to help you to be as successful in your role as possible. As a school, staff have access to a range of benefits from day one, including a good pension, the Cycle to Work scheme, and access to an Employee Assistance Programme, alongside supportive policies.

The wellbeing of our staff is paramount and we are always improving what we can offer. We regularly seek staff views, listen and take action to ensure staff feel as supported and valued as possible. We have recently introduced an annual 'Wellbeing Day' which staff have shared has a positive impact on their own wellbeing.

Our staff are incredibly dedicated to our students, but are also incredibly supportive towards one another. As well as your immediate department or team, you will get to know staff across the school who each bring something unique to our school community. In recent exit interviews, 100% of staff said that they would recommend TGGGS as a place to work.



# TORBAY AND BEYOND



We are extremely lucky to be located within such a wonderful part of the world, and part of a superb community. Our school is situated in Torquay and part of the wider Torbay area which is also home to the coastal towns of Paignton and Brixham. Torbay has so much to offer including beautiful harbours, popular tourist attractions, and plenty of choice when it comes to fish & chips or an ice cream! Although located in Torquay, many staff and pupils commute from far and wide including Exeter, Plymouth, East Devon, and even Cornwall, using the excellent transport links available, as well as car sharing.



Our school is only a 30 minute walk to the closest beach, and driving distance to so many other stunning beaches and coastal towns including Dartmouth and Salcombe. As well as access to renowned coastlines within the English Riviera and the South Hams, Torquay also provides easy access to Dartmoor where there are endless walks and quaint villages to visit.
