The School

Pipers Corner is a Girls' School Association (GSA) and Heads' Conference Association (HMC) Independent School for girls aged 4-18. Set in 96 acres of beautiful Chiltern countryside, the School is four miles north of High Wycombe and two miles from Great Missenden. In its most recent ISI inspection (March 2026), Pipers Corner School met all of the required Independent School Standards across every area of the inspection.

Founded in 1930, the school was established on its current site in 1945. The school now comprises of approximately 600 students and employs more than 170 staff. Demand for a place at Pipers has increased in recent years, and we remain full.

Our site has incredible facilities to inspire the next generation, we have a 280 seat theatre, fully equipped for our student technical team, with plenty of performances for our aspiring performers. Our Pipers Radio studio broadcasts live every lunchtime.

Sporting facilities include the swimming pool, fitness suite, astro pitch and gymnasium. Forest school is conducted in our on-site woodland, and to encourage environmental awareness we have two outdoor eco-classrooms with wind turbines and water butts. Students of all ages benefit from outdoor lessons in our wildflower meadow.

The Role

The Head of Prep Drama will work under the Director of Drama teaching Reception (to Year 8 where required) and contributing to the extra-curricular provision for the Lower School. The successful candidate will have an excellent knowledge of contemporary theatre practice and will understand that the process of creating Drama is as, if not more, important than performance. Experience of teaching this age range is essential.

The Drama Department

The Drama Department is part of a vibrant Performing Arts Faculty at Pipers Corner School. The Drama, Dance and Music Departments work very closely together, and we encourage our students to strengthen and develop their performance skills in all three disciplines. Whether they start their education with us at Pre-Prep, Prep, or in Senior School, Curriculum Drama is taught by Drama specialists at every level. The Department is currently staffed by the Director of Drama, Assistant Director of Drama, the Head of Prep Drama and a Drama Assistant. The Drama Department offers a full and varied range of extracurricular activities including performances of whole-school musicals and for Senior Students plays by modern contemporary dramatists, immersive productions inspired by Punchdrunk and international visits to New York. Our strengths as a department are in making theatre accessible to students of all abilities. We excel in musical theatre but provide opportunities for all those with a specialised interest, such as technical theatre, costume and film making. The theatrical ethos of the Department is to produce work that is creatively challenging and experimental, giving our students a diverse theatrical experience and fully preparing them from the moment they arrive at Pipers to study Drama in Higher Education or in just gaining fantastic communication skills and a love for theatre before moving on to other careers.

The Prep Department

The Prep Department at Pipers is a fully integrated part of the school, comprising 88 students within a thriving independent school of around 600 students. It operates as a single-form entry in Years 3, 4, and 5, expanding to two forms in Year 6, with class sizes ranging from 16 to 20. All classes receive a double drama lesson (80 minutes) per week. Extracurricular participation rates are very high within the subject. Outstanding facilities are available for sessions including the Theatre, Drama Studio and Prep Hall.



Specific Responsibilities

Principal

- To work with the Director of Drama to lead and manage the provision of Drama in the Prep and Pre-Prep Departments
- To work with the Heads of Prep Music and Prep Art, and the Head of Dance, to develop cross-curricular links
- To direct Prep and Pre-Prep productions as required, whilst ensuring the curriculum is focused around the process of creating drama, challenging the expectation that all work will lead to performance
- To teach Drama from Reception to Year 8
- To innovate, inspire and challenge how students and their parents perceive Drama and performance
- To demonstrate passion for specific or niche areas of theatre to inspire and enthuse our students with the desire to be creative and to help them grow into interesting and innovative performers
- To assess, record and report the performance of pupils at every stage, adjusting teaching strategies as necessary, and to take particular responsibility for the collation and recording of this data for the department
- To implement and manage a strategy for Gifted and Talented Drama students, ensuring that they are provided with stretch and challenge
- To write quality subject reports, meeting deadlines as published in the academic calendar
- To attend regular departmental meetings both in Drama, Prep and Pre-Prep
- To attend parents' evenings and communicate and consult with parents of girls when necessary throughout the year
- To support the Director of Drama in the development of the bi-annual departmental Development plan
- To contribute to the Enrichment programme of the School by offering a club/activity
- To attend regular whole staff meetings, INSET days and school functions as published in the year's calendar
- To uphold the policies of the school ensuring, for example, that expectations of a girl's conduct are consistent with the school's Behaviour and Discipline policy, so that good order and discipline are maintained
- To be responsible for helping to manage resources and equipment ensuring that good practice is followed according to the school's Health and Safety procedures
