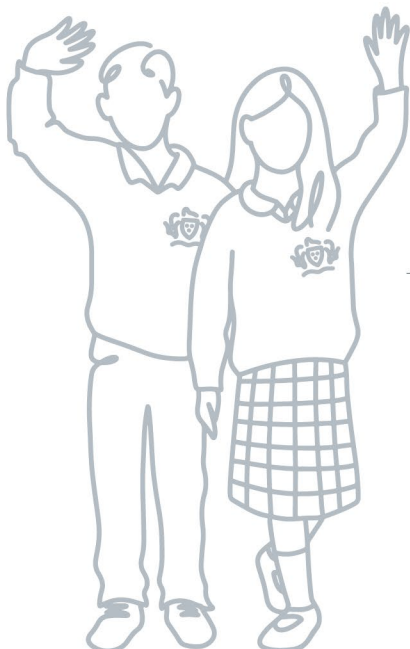

The *Department*

The Geography Department consists of six members of staff. The ethos is academic, but a dynamic and warm collegiate atmosphere actively supports collaboration. All members contribute to the production and sharing of resources, along with wider participation in departmental activities. The department occupies a suite of four specialist rooms on the top floor of the main school building. All classrooms are equipped with ICT facilities including interactive whiteboards. Classes use a combination of devices and books in their lessons.

Geography is studied by all students in Years 7-9. The department continues to develop diverse and contemporary schemes of work that address many of the issues facing the world in the twenty-first century including Climate Change, Resource Management and Globalisation. The department places great emphasis on independent learning and has sought to develop teaching styles and methods that allow for individual and group ownership of the work. Local fieldwork is offered for all year groups and the use of GIS is being integrated into the curriculum.

Geography is a popular subject at GCSE, with typically about half of the year group choosing it as an option. The department follows the AQA Specification and recent results have been very strong, with 45% gaining a 9 and 78% 8-9 in 2025. The syllabus offers a broad range of topics. The students begin the syllabus in Year 9 in order to create space for creativity and scholarship in our lessons. They undertake fieldwork in both Year 10 and 11.

Geography is a popular option at A Level following the Cambridge International A Level specification. The course offers a broad yet contemporary look at the challenges that face the planet with many topics building on the foundations that were covered in the lower years. In Year 12 students cover Atmosphere and Weather, Hydrology and Earth Processes on the physical side and Population and Migration, Water Management and Urban Areas on the human side. There is a four-day residential fieldwork trip to investigate these topics in the real world, but no NEA requirement. In Year 13 they undertake Hazardous Environments and Coastal Environments on the physical side and Trade, Aid and Tourism and Environmental Management on the human side. Again, results at A Level are strong with an average of 52% of students achieving an A* and 79% achieving A/A* since 2022. Geography has been a popular choice for undergraduate study in recent years and we often have many pupils applying for Geography or Geography-related degrees, including several Oxbridge candidates.

The *Department*

Co-curricular activities and enrichment are also a key part of the department. Fieldwork is an integral part of Geography and all years are catered for with both compulsory and optional trips. The department is running an Iceland trip in October 2026 and an Argentina trip in October 2027, both of which were very popular and oversubscribed. There is also an active GeogSoc run by A Level geographers who arrange weekly activities for all year groups as well as one-off events (such as a recent school wide debate on Veganism).

The department are therefore looking for someone who not only enjoys engaging pupils at a high level, but is prepared to work closely with colleagues to help deliver the GCSE and A-level courses and also develop our enrichment and co-curricular opportunities for pupils.



The *Person*

We are looking for an enthusiastic and motivated candidate to join our team in a thriving Geography Department as a Geography Teacher on a year fixed term contract from September 2026. We would also be open to the contract running for two terms (rather than a full academic year) from September 2026 and we would also consider someone who wished to work on a part-time basis.

The successful candidate will be able to demonstrate sound subject knowledge, high academic standards and an ability to enthuse pupils of all ages. Lessons designed to challenge pupil thinking and develop independent study skills are central to teaching at Bancroft's and a willingness to contribute to resources in this area is essential.

Key *Responsibilities*

Below is a summary of the key responsibilities of the Teacher of Geography (Fixed Term).

- To deliver subject curriculum to pupils
- Teaching pupils through the School at Key Stages 3, 4 and 5, including examined groups at GCSE and A Level
- To mark, assess and grade within the department, always setting the highest standards of personal organisation and administration
- To attend regular meetings of the department, both formal and informal, to discuss policy, teaching methods, approaches to the subject and the sharing of common problems and concerns
- Adhering to departmental policies and to meet School deadlines insofar as it applies to the department
- To assist in the induction of new staff into the department, where required
- To engage in ongoing professional learning, including an annual review

Responsibilities in relation to the pupils and to what is taught:

- To keep abreast of developments in the subject, maintaining contacts with professional associations
- To participate in discussion, within the department, on the development of appropriate syllabuses and schemes of work at all levels
- To develop new teaching and learning resources and sharing them with pupils and colleagues
- To ensure pupils are properly prepared for exams and entered for exams and overseeing course work
- To participate in the setting and marking of internal exams and determining appropriate grade boundaries thereafter
- To assist with trips and other co-curricular activities in relation to the department
- To give appropriate guidance to pupils who wish to study the subject at further levels
- To maintain the image of the subject as an interesting and valuable one. Keeping learning environments stimulating and interesting

Key *Responsibilities*

Responsibilities in relation to the School:

- To carry out School policy, including the School safety policy, in the context of the department
- To contribute to the co-curricular life of the school
- To communicate departmental matters to the Head of Department, discussing examination results and raising issues of concern
- To set and mark entrance exams and interviewing where necessary
- To support the use of ICT within the department
- To present the department at Open Days etc. as the need arises and in prospectuses
- To ensure that the facilities used by the department, including equipment and teaching areas, are maintained in an appropriate condition

All teachers are expected to contribute to our pupils' holistic development and the co-curricular life of the school, outside their timetabled day and beyond their curriculum subject. This may include events, training or rehearsals, for example, after school and at weekends, and running or staffing residential trips, as well as a standard expectation of regular clubs for both curriculum extension and the co-curriculum.
