

Job Title: Learning Support Assistant

Grade: 5

Responsible to: Senior Leadership Team

Key Relationships: Teachers, Other classroom support staff, SENDCo

Occupational Standards: Supporting Teaching and Learning (STL) Level 2

Job Purpose: A Learning Support Assistant will work under the direct supervision of a teacher to provide support for teaching and learning and associated activities in accordance with school policies and procedures. This will include supporting individuals on a 1:1 basis and providing general support for whole class learning activities or supporting small groups of pupils.

Main Duties and Responsibilities:

1. To provide agreed support to the teacher in the delivery of planned whole class learning activities.
2. To work under the direct supervision of a teacher to carry out planned learning activities with individual pupils or small groups, providing feedback on their engagement in activities and their achievement of the desired learning objectives.
3. To help prepare, monitor and maintain a safe and secure learning environment in line with the teacher's lesson plans. To observe and feed back to the teacher on pupil performance and behaviour, taking action as appropriate in line with relevant school policies.
4. To support the physical, intellectual, emotional and social development of pupils, including contributing ideas and suggestions to support planning, to meet their development needs.
5. To interact with and respond positively to children, young people and adults.
6. To develop positive relationships with colleagues, providing consistent and effective support and working constructively as a member of the school staff team.
7. To support pupils to improve their numeracy and literacy skills through focused learning activities and more generally across the curriculum.
8. To prepare and utilise ICT resources to support pupils learning.
9. To prepare and support the use of learning materials and create visual displays, in accordance with the requirements of the teacher, in order to facilitate a relevant physical learning environment.
10. To contribute to the provision of support for bilingual / multilingual pupils if required.
11. To provide care and encouragement to children and young people with disabilities or special educational needs, supporting them to participate in activities and liaising, if required, with parents / carers / other professionals as appropriate.
12. To invigilate internal and external tests and examinations under formal conditions.

13. To encourage participation in structured and unstructured learning activities, including play (timetabled and during breaks if required). (Primary and Special schools).
14. To undertake midday supervision duties. (if required).
15. To provide toileting support to pupils as necessary.
16. To support, as appropriate, in instances where pupils are unwell whilst at the school/college.
17. If required to provide ongoing medical support. Full training will be provided via outside agencies.
18. Experience of working with children with SEN is desirable but not essential.

SPECIAL FACTORS:

Subject to the duration of the need, the special conditions given below apply:

- a. The postholder may be required to attend, from time to time, training courses, conferences, seminars or other meetings as required by his/her own training needs and the needs of the school.
- b. Expenses will be paid in accordance with the Local Conditions of Service.

This post is eligible for a DBS check under the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act 1974 (Exceptions) Order 1975 (i.e. it involves certain activities in relation to children and/or adults) and is defined as regulated activity under Part 1 of the Safeguarding Vulnerable Groups Act 2006. Therefore, a DBS enhanced check for a regulated activity (includes a barred list check) is an essential requirement.

This job description sets out the duties and responsibilities of the post at the time when it was drawn up. Such duties and responsibilities may vary from time to time without changing the general character of the duties or the level of responsibility entailed. Such variations are a common occurrence and cannot themselves justify a reconsideration of the grading of the post.
