Our Nursery

The brand-new nursery has been thoughtfully designed to create a warm and nurturing environment for young children and babies. Featuring natural materials, plants, and abundant sunlight, the environment seeks to inspire curiosity and encourage exploration. Alongside indoor spaces of the very highest quality, which include a Piazza for the nursery community to come together, and an artist's studio, Little Pips has invested significant funds in the outdoor area, to provide children with a large, bespoke outdoor environment in which they can explore, experiment and embark on adventures without limits.

Our Approach

Central to Little Pips Nursery is its adoption of the Reggio Emilia approach, an internationally recognised educational philosophy originating in Italy. This approach views children as curious, capable, and competent individuals, placing emphasis on creativity, collaboration, and exploration to foster a lifelong love of learning and respect for each child's unique interests.

What sets Little Pips apart is its comprehensive offering. The nursery combines the expertise of highly qualified and passionate educators with access to Forest School sessions, and the use of 32 acres of outdoor space. Children also benefit from nutritious, locally sourced meals prepared by an in-house chef, creating a truly holistic approach to early years care and education.

Understanding the needs of busy parents, the nursery offers a unique feature: 'The Pip Stop!' This welcoming space allows parents to take a moment for themselves—whether to enjoy a coffee, catch up on emails, or simply recharge—before starting the rest of their day.

Job Description

ATELIERISTA (ARTIST IN RESIDENCE)

Reporting To:

Nursery Manager

The Atelierista plays a key role in working closely with children and educators, fostering artistic expression and exploration in our purpose-built atelier (studio). As an Atelierista, you will guide children in discovering the language of art and materials, supporting their projects and inspiring their curiosity. This parttime role is a unique opportunity for an artist with a passion for early childhood education to contribute to a dynamic and innovative learning environment.

Child Protection

The post holder is responsible for promoting and safeguarding the welfare of children and young persons for whom they are responsible, or with whom they come into contact, and will adhere to and ensure compliance with the Foundation's Child Protection Policy Statement at all times.

If, in the course of carrying out the duties of the post, the post holder becomes aware of any actual or potential risks to the safety or welfare of children in the school they must report any concerns to the Designated Safeguarding Lead or to the Head.

Key Responsibilities:

1. Artistic Practice & Guidance:

- Plan and lead creative projects that align with the Reggio Emilia philosophy, encouraging children to express their ideas through a wide range of materials and techniques.
- Introduce children to various artistic processes, including painting, drawing, sculpting, and mixed media.
- Support children in documenting their work and ideas, fostering a sense of ownership and pride in their creations.

2. Collaboration with Educators:

- Work collaboratively with educators to integrate artistic exploration into the broader curriculum and daily activities.
- Act as a mentor to staff, sharing techniques and ideas to enhance the creative experiences offered to children.
- Participate in team planning sessions, bringing a creative perspective to discussions about children's learning and development.
- Atelier (Studio) Management:
- Maintain and organise the atelier as an inviting and inspiring space, ensuring it is well-stocked with high-quality, sustainable, and diverse materials.
- Create displays of children's artwork to celebrate their creativity and document their learning journey.
- Ensure the atelier is a safe environment, adhering to health and safety standards.

3. Child Engagement & Support:

- Encourage children to explore their own ideas and interests through art, fostering confidence and independence.
- Support children in developing problem-solving and critical thinking skills through creative experimentation.
- Celebrate the individuality of each child's artistic expression, ensuring every child feels valued and respected.
- Community & Parental Engagement:
- Share children's creative projects with families through exhibitions, portfolios, and workshops.



 Support the organisation of events, such as art shows or collaborative projects, to engage families and the wider community in the children's creative process.
