Thank you for your interest in the post of HLTA Maths.

This role complements the curriculum offering in the Maths Team at TGS.

It will involve planning, preparing and delivering lessons to small numbers of students as well as monitoring pupils, assessing, recording and reporting on pupils' achievement and progress, under the direction of the Curriculum Team Leader. The small groups of students are likely to be selected from those who are working towards age expected outcomes, up to Foundation GCSE level.

The contract is for 28.75 hours per week, term time only (including training days) fixed term for one year up to 31st August 2027. Your working days will be Monday - Friday. Your hours include planning and preparation time and one duty per week with the requirement to undertake a form.

Job Title: Higher Level Teaching Assistant

JOB TITLE: HLTA Maths (with specific responsibility for Maths tutoring up to GCSE level)

GRADE: Grade F

RESPONSIBLE TO: CTL Maths

RESPONSIBILITIES AND KEY TASKS

Specific Responsibilities:

- Plan teaching for sequenced learning objectives, prepare or source and deliver learning activities and evaluate and adjust lessons/work plans according to pupil responses/needs.
- Monitor or record and evaluate pupil responses to learning activities through a range of assessment and monitoring strategies against predetermined learning objectives.
- Interact with pupils in ways that support and nurture the development of their ability to think and learn, and work independently.
- Support the development and implementation of appropriate behaviour management strategies, to anticipate and manage behaviour constructively, promoting self-control and independence.
- Support pupils in their social and emotional wellbeing, and develop and implement related social, health and physical programmes.
- Take account of the effects of different parenting approaches, background and routines, and be involved in home school liaison.
- Encourage and motivate pupils to promote independence and resilience and increase self-esteem.
- Participate in the development, implementation and monitoring of systems relating to attendance and integration e.g. registration, truancy, pastoral systems etc.
- Accompany or act as a group leader on educational visits, and other activities outside of the classroom, supervising the pupils
- Provide supervision during breaks as required
- Organise and manage an appropriate learning environment and resources.
- Coordinate the activities of students entering the school for the purpose of work experience/ work placements.
- Support the use of ICT to advance pupils' learning and use common ICT tools for own and pupils' learning.
- Assist with administrative support e.g. dealing with correspondence, compilation/ analysis, reporting on attendance, exclusions etc., making phone calls.
- Supervise and provide access arrangements for pupils sitting internal and external examinations, ensuring that examinations comply with Examination Board Regulations.
- Participate in training and appraisal
- Cover short term teacher absence and communicate pupil activities through a range of assessment and monitoring strategies against predetermined learning objectives.
