**Principal Duties and Responsibilities including Overall Job purpose:**

The HLTA role will involve leading the teaching and learning for whole classes in the absence of the class teacher and for specific group and individual interventions. The successful candidate will be responsible for the planning of learning opportunities and tasks when needed, including the marking and assessment of pupils' learning. The HLTA will be expected to lead on aspects of the wider support worker team.
