The Nursery Lead will:

- Lead and develop a high-quality Nursery provision that supports children to thrive academically, socially and emotionally
- Create a nurturing, stimulating and language-rich learning environment both indoors and outdoors
- Plan and deliver engaging, developmentally appropriate learning experiences in line with the EYFS curriculum
- Foster strong relationships with children, families and staff
- Support children to develop independence, communication, curiosity and confidence
- Work collaboratively across the Early Years team, including opportunities to teach and support within Reception
- Promote high expectations, inclusion and positive behaviour
- Ensure children feel safe, valued and ready to learn

Key Responsibilities

Teaching and learning

- Plan and deliver high-quality learning opportunities which meet the needs of all children
- Use ongoing assessment and observation to inform planning and next steps
- Create an engaging environment that promotes curiosity, exploration and independence
- Support the development of early communication, language, literacy and mathematics skills
- Provide a balance of adult-led and child-initiated learning opportunities
- Support smooth transitions into Nursery and Reception
- Contribute to wider EYFS curriculum development

Leadership of nursery provision

- Lead the day-to-day organisation and running of the Nursery
- Support and direct Teaching Assistants and other adults within the provision
- Ensure high standards of care, learning and behaviour
- Promote effective routines and consistent expectations
- Monitor the quality of provision and learning environments
- Contribute to the continued development of the Nursery provision

Relationships with children and families

- Build strong, positive and trusting relationships with children and families
- Welcome and settle children into Nursery provision
- Develop effective home-school communication
- Support parents in understanding children's learning and development
- Promote inclusion and ensure all children feel represented and valued

SEND and inclusion

- Support children with SEND and additional needs within the Nursery environment
- Work collaboratively with the SENDCO and external agencies where appropriate
- Adapt provision to meet individual needs
- Promote inclusive practice and equality of opportunity

Pastoral and wellbeing

- Promote children's emotional wellbeing and personal development
- Support children in developing social skills, resilience and independence
- Maintain high expectations for behaviour through positive relationships and routines
- Ensure safeguarding and child protection procedures are followed at all times

Health and safety

- Maintain a safe, stimulating and organised learning environment
- Ensure equipment and resources are used safely and appropriately
- Administer First Aid where required
- Follow school procedures relating to medical needs, accidents and medication

Working with Colleagues and the Wider Trust

- Work collaboratively with colleagues across the school and Campfire Education Trust

- Engage positively with professional development opportunities
- Share good practice and contribute to school improvement
- Develop effective professional relationships with colleagues and external professionals

The nursery lead will be required to safeguard and promote the welfare of children and young people, and follow school policies and the staff code of conduct.
