Academic success

Knights Templar is a school with a strong academic focus. We are committed to providing an excellent education and we encourage and support our students to do the very best they can in all their studies. Students of all abilities are successful and achieve high standards here, in all aspects of their school life. Our students' GCSE results are consistently well above national averages and each year the majority of our students get 9 good GCSEs or better and many achieve at least 3 A*/A grades. We are equally proud of the academic achievements of our Sixth Form students; every year many go on to study a wide range of degrees at the most prestigious universities in the country.

Opportunities for all abilities

Whilst the majority of students thrive in the Knights Templar family, some will find study and other aspects of school life difficult. Our teachers, Pastoral Care team and Learning Development department provide support and advice to students and their families to help each and every student fulfil their potential.

Whichever path our students take, when they leave they are well prepared for the next phase of their education – whether a student is part of the high proportion of Year 11 who choose to stay on to Sixth Form or whether they progress to full-time courses in Further Education or apprenticeships.

Participation beyond the classroom

Education is not simply about academic success. It is about participation and achievement that goes beyond the classroom. In its broadest sense, it is about preparing our students for life after school: about helping them to be successful, valuable and valued citizens.

We want our young people to be engaged and challenged and to achieve their full potential. We recognise the value that extra-curricular activities play in this development. Our school has a deserved reputation for the quality and range of extra-curricular activities that we offer.

Outdoor and overseas experiences

Our students have many opportunities to take part in a variety of field trips, outdoor pursuits and visits, some of which are overseas. In recent years these have included trips to the Himalayas, the Three Peaks, America, Germany and France.

Extensive extra-curricular opportunities

All students are encouraged in sport, dance, drama, music, outdoor and community activities, as well as lunchtime and after-school clubs such as computing, film, fishing, gardening and many others. Musical excellence is supported by lunchtime and evening groups, choirs and ensembles, whilst concerts with professional musicians and biannual overseas music tours are a regular feature of school life. Drama is also strong within the school, with a wide range of opportunities for all ages, including school productions that in recent years have included Sweet Charity, Nicholas Nickleby and, most recently, The Sound of Music. Our extensive playing fields, sports centre and floodlit artificial turf pitch enable us to offer a broad spectrum of sports and games. Inter-house matches and sports days encourage an atmosphere of healthy competition and our students are very successful in district and county competitions, with many achieving representative honours.

The value of teamwork

The Duke of Edinburgh's Award scheme aims to develop young people through adventure, challenge, service, learning new skills and teamwork. We have actively promoted the scheme for over thirty years at Knights Templar and during this period, in excess of 2,000 of our students have received Bronze, Silver and Gold awards. Currently, over 50 per cent of our Year 9 students take part in the Bronze award and many of these will continue to their Gold award in Sixth Form; making Knights Templar the largest Duke of Edinburgh centre in the county.

Strong local community links

We are proud to serve our local community, with students' learning greatly enhanced by the strong ties we share. These include links with the primary schools within our priority area, which are particularly important to us. Primary school students visit us several times before they join Year 7 and we pride ourselves on the transition that takes place at age 11.

An environment where children thrive

Children matter at Knights Templar. Every child is valued and nurtured here. Our students thrive in an environment that couples opportunities and expectations with clear boundaries.

Support and guidance throughout their school life

Our pastoral system is designed to ensure that all students are known as individuals, are cared for, supported and succeed. This provides them with guidance throughout their time at school.

Each student is placed in a form group, based on the school's house system, with a tutor who sees them through Years 7 to 11 and gets to know them personally. There are regular target-setting and monitoring meetings with tutors to agree priorities for improvement, and our Year Leaders take responsibility for the academic progress, welfare and behaviour of their group of students as they undertake their secondary school journey. Students are also given access to specialist help in areas such as careers advice and counselling should they need it.

Children's opinions matter to us

We don't simply talk about mutual respect; it is a value we live by. We listen to what our students have to say about the school and our active school council with representatives from every form is an important voice. In recent years, the school council has taken a lead in making the school more environmentally aware and it takes a central role in the interview process for the appointment of many new teaching staff. This engagement is vital in engendering the sense of belonging, pride and commitment to the school that is so common amongst our students and often remarked upon by visitors.

Preparing our Sixth Formers for life after school

Our Sixth Form is one of the largest and most successful in Hertfordshire and is an integral part of the school. The majority of our students stay on after GCSE and are joined by others from both state and independent schools, keen to learn at Knights Templar.

We recognise that while our Sixth Formers are no longer children, they are not quite adults either, which is why we offer them a range of responsibilities, privileges and support to help continue their development in preparation for leaving us. They benefit from being included in the life of the wider school, taking on significant roles in leading sport, music, drama, and also acting as mentors and role models to our younger students as ambassadors across many other subjects.

A broad and varied curriculum

The Sixth Form offers a very wide range of AS and A2 courses with most combinations being possible; these subjects are supplemented further with a number of applied and vocational options. We deliver this programme through a variety of lesson formats and study approaches, making the learning experience at Knights Templar a hugely rewarding experience.

We also have an excellent track record of supporting students to move on to Higher Education and employment. Our tutorial system assists and prepares students to make the right choices for their future and over 100 students per year progress on to university degree courses, some in the most sought-after subjects and at the most highly regarded universities, including Oxford and Cambridge.

Developing leadership qualities

Leadership is an important quality in young people and there are many opportunities for our Sixth Formers to gain and develop experience and skills in this area. From our mentoring and support programme to our involvement in Young Enterprise; from our work in the youth wing of Rotary 'Interact' to our students supporting Year 7 forms, our Sixth Form students are vital in facilitating and promoting a variety of enrichment initiatives right across the school.

We also have a well-established Prefect Programme in the Sixth Form, including a Head Boy and Head Girl appointed by a combination of election by fellow students and a formal interview. Our prefects represent the school on many public occasions throughout the year. We take great pride in knowing that by the time they leave us, our Sixth Formers have developed self-confidence in an atmosphere that gives them the broadest opportunities academically, culturally and socially.
