Job Description

Intervention Lead

Purpose

To design, coordinate, deliver, and evaluate high-quality interventions, both 1:1 and in small groups, that improve outcomes for pupils with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND), ensuring barriers to learning are reduced and pupils are supported to make progress academically, socially, and emotionally.

Responsibilities:

- Work with the SENCo and wider SEND team to identify pupils requiring targeted interventions.
- Plan, deliver and oversee evidence-based interventions, which may focus around one of the four areas of need; Cognition and Learning, Communication and Interaction, Social, Emotional and Mental health and Sensory and/or Physical needs.
- Adapt interventions to meet the diverse needs of individual pupils.
- Track, assess and record impact of interventions using both qualitative and quantitative measures.
- Monitor attendance, engagement and progress of pupils in intervention groups in order to ensure that interventions are purposeful and effective.
- Build positive, trusting relationships with pupils to foster confidence and independence.
- Work closely with the wider school to support students' academic, social, and emotional development.
- Support the SEND team in creating and maintaining the school's SEND provision map.
- Liaise with parents, carers and other key stakeholders as needed.
- Work with the wider staff body to safeguard all children, being mindful of the increased vulnerabilities of students with SEND.
- Engage fully in the academy appraisal process to fulfil personal potential and be able to participate effectively in the implementation of the academy's goals and improvement plan.
- Attend meetings/training and carry out tasks and duties as specified on the academy calendar.
- Consistently implement all academy policies.
- Contribute to decision-making and consultation procedures.
- Report any safeguarding concerns immediately to a Designated Safeguarding Lead.
- Carry out any other reasonable duties as requested by the Headteacher.

This job description is not necessarily a comprehensive definition of the post. It will be reviewed annually.
