PHYSICAL EDUCATION AT WEAVERHAM HIGH SCHOOL

Our Physical Education Department is staffed by a strong team of specialists whose commitment to school sport is recognised as a real strength of Weaverham High School. The team understand the importance of providing a vast range of extra-curricular opportunities for pupils and as a result we have exceptional levels of participation. An impressive number of our pupils are regularly selected to participate in regional and national competitions – of which the entire school community is immensely proud. Pupils and parents value all we offer in terms of experience and enrichment opportunities and the department is at the heart of school life. The team are equally committed to driving academic standards for pupils who opt for GCSE Physical Education (AQA Board) and Sports Studies (OCR Cambridge National).

All our staff have high standards of behaviour and Weaverham pupils feel safe and secure. Our staff build strong relationships with every individual pupil - they nurture their personal growth and through carefully designed experiences support them to become resilient and curious learners, aspirational individuals and confident leaders.

The school has good facilities for its' PE provision including a Sports Hall, Gymnasium, School hall and Small Dance Studio. Our outdoor facilities include a hard court MUGA where we conduct activities such as Netball, Tennis and Handball. We also have extensive playing fields with Football and Rugby dual use pitches, (8 lane grass athletics track in the summer), long jump pit and throwing circles for Athletics. We also have a 4G playing surface being built, which should be fully operational by next academic year.

Currently all pupils in Key Stage 3 receive two hours per week of PE. Our Curriculum INTENT for KS3 PE demonstrates clear challenge and progression, developing students holistically across all aspects of Physical Education. Year 7 comprises of students learning core skills and knowledge, moving into Year 8 were students develop their tactical understanding within each activity and then finally, in Year 9, students develop their leadership and analysis skills.

Within KS3 PE, we conduct three theory weeks within the academic year, so students will complete 6 theory lessons in total. The purpose of these lessons is to instil key terminology and language from our KS4 examination courses to students at an earlier stage in their development, alongside giving students a taste of what a theory lesson in KS4 looks like.

In **Key Stage 3 PE** lessons pupils follow Schemes of Learning in activities in the following areas:

Athletics, Badminton, Basketball, Dance, Fitness, Football, Gymnastics, Handball, Netball, Orienteering, Rugby Union, Striking and Fielding (Rounders, Cricket, Softball), Table Tennis, Tennis & Volleyball.

At **Key Stage 4** all pupils undertake one hour per week of core PE. They will participate in a range of activities including:

In Year 10 students complete a 4-week carousel of activities that include: *Athletics, Badminton, Basketball, Dance, Fitness, Football, Handball, Netball, Striking and Fielding (Rounders, Cricket, Softball), Table Tennis, Tennis & Volleyball.*

In Year 11, the pupils follow a programme of activities that allows them to further develop their skills and enjoyment across an array of activities.

Excellence in Leadership

Working with our young people to enable them to become the leaders of tomorrow is at the heart of our ethos. We want to work in collaboration with young people to help them develop self confidence, improve communication and listening skills and be able to value leadership qualities that will shape the adults they become. The PE Department is committed to this and has a strong tradition of developing Sports Leaders. The school works with the local primary schools and many Key Stage 4 pupils help with primary school PE lessons and sports days. In addition, a number of specialist sports festivals are held to facilitate the development of our pupils' leadership skills.

Extra-Curricular Programme

The Department operates an extensive extra-curricular programme offering a wide range of team sports and individual activities for both girls and boys. We have a large student attendance after school every afternoon, for PE and sport-based activities. Our clubs are led by the PE department, alongside other dedicated members of staff who invest their time in this critical aspect of school life.

The successful applicant will be expected to play an active role in this enrichment programme, with particular focus on leading Netball in the Winter and collaborating with the Head of Department within Athletics for the Summer term. These sessions mainly take place after-school from a Monday-Thursday with some Saturday's being needed for Cross Country and Athletics fixtures. However, these amount to only two per academic year.

Not only do we provide extensive mass participation opportunities but over recent years, we have had major local, regional and national successes across an array of sports. We regularly qualify for the Regional Round of the English Schools Cup for Cross Country and Athletics. Alongside this, we have a strong tradition of winning local Netball leagues and our boys and girls Football teams have had outstanding successes in district and national competitions.

We also continue to develop, nurture and support a variety of students who have ambitions of becoming professional athletes and compete to a National standard outside of school. These students have competed in sports such as Athletics, Cross-Country, Football, Rugby Union & League & Swimming.

We have recently just conducted a Sports Tour to Spain, for our Year 9 & 10 girls and boys football squads and Year 10 netball squad. This was an invaluable experience for all students involved and is an initiative we will look to carry on in the future.

I hope you are excited by the opportunity of joining this dedicated and committed PE team. You will find the department to be right at the centre of school life and enjoy the recognition of being part of a very successful team. Pupils value PE highly and participation rates are very strong. You will make a significant contribution to making this provision even better.
